Dear Donors, Partners and Friends:

Turkish Philanthropy Funds turned 12 this year. As we look at how far we've come, we celebrate our progress toward fulfilling founder Haldun Tashman's vision of serving a community of dedicated, passionate philanthropists and partners.

With each person, family and company that joins the TPF community, we are writing a new narrative about how we can address social challenges together. The need is great and growing in many places. But seeing the impact that our community can make keeps us hopeful that the work we do today can create a **lasting legacy**.

TPF continues to grow. This year, our assets totaled more than \$13 million, including \$4.7 million in gifts. Each gift, represents a story of personal passion and motivation. So, in this annual

report we wanted to highlight some of these incredible stories as a way to honor and thank our donors and partners – and also inspire others to action.

Read about George Schieber who established a **legacy** fund to create the Sena Eken Schieber Economics Award, in memory of his brilliant and successful wife, Sena. The Award supports young women from Turkey who want to continue their advanced studies in the field of Economics, where women have been underrepresented. Be inspired by Nur Hamzaogullari, and her husband Aziz, who joined TPF's Founders Society in order to give back to Turkey in a sustained way. Discover how Onur Karayal, a physician, researcher, and retired pharmaceutical executive and his friends established a Giving Circle to support girls' education. We thank each of them – and all those who have entrusted TPF to help grow their philanthropic impact – for their generosity and involvement.

Our donors' involvement – through their time, experience and financial support – also allows us to make impactful grantmaking. Last year, TPF made more than \$2 million in grants and we have now reached total grantmaking of more than \$19 million since 2007. We continue to be the leading philanthropic organization dedicated to the Turkish community.

TPF grantees work each day to address the root causes of social problems and we are grateful for the partnerships that we have built with a dedicated and experienced community of organizations. Our approach is to support them in bringing innovative solutions and building relationships that help close these gaps for the long-term. We are excited about continuing to grow our support, especially in key areas of need.

One of our growing areas of support is focused on entrepreneurship – not only supporting young entrepreneurs and start-ups but also creating incentives that encourage entrepreneurial-minded people to start their businesses. The Bolu Entrepreneurship Project, *BiBolu Girişimciliğin Yeni Merkezi*, for example, invests in the city's "entrepreneurship ecosystem" in order to strengthen the social and economic fabric of the community.

Education remains our biggest area of grantmaking and donor support. TPF is involved in a range of areas – from teacher development to specialized higher education scholarships. We are particularly proud of the new investments we've been making in after-school education. Research confirms that youth who participate in afterschool programs enjoy a range of positive academic, social-emotional and health benefits. The programs we have supported help build the skills that are necessary for youth to succeed in the 21st century global economy and world. TPF works with organizations such as TEGV, ILKYAR, FABSIT, PAYDA, Young Guru Academy, and TOÇEV to provide quality after school and summer programs – and the demand is growing.

Finally, world events have made forced immigration one of the biggest problems of our time and one that impacts Turkey in particular. TPF works with partners that support the integration of immigrant families into society. The way we work with our partners such as Maya Foundation and Helping Hands favors skills building, mobilizing networks and resources for integration. We are deeply committed to funding programs that help provide inclusive opportunities for those who had been forced from their homes.

No reflection on the past year would be complete without acknowledging our most important assets: the people who guide, staff and give to TPF. We are grateful to our Founders Society members, fundholders, donors, community partners, volunteer leadership, management and all those that have collaborated with us to promote the well-being, vibrancy, and philanthropic spirit of the communities we serve. You are the only reason we exist, succeed and thrive. This report is to honor every one of you since you are making a real difference every day for our communities.

Looking ahead, this year we were very excited to appoint three new directors to TPF's board. New board members Zeynep Oğuz Bilimer, a notable creative director and a philanthropist; Barbaros Karaahmet, the co-chair of the Herrick Feinstein's Turkish Practice Group; and Osman Coşkun Kurtuluş, the Chief Financial Officer of the Museum of the City of New York, all bring a wealth of experience and commitment to our work. We are so appreciative of the many years served on the board by three of our directors who have stepped down this past year: Bilge Öğün Bassani, Nur Hamzaogullari and Lincoln McCurdy. Their dedication and considerable contributions will be sorely missed.

Legacy comes in many forms.

Our greatest impact is made possible through the innumerable contributions that our generous donors have made. Your passion for giving and care for community, combined with our philanthropic expertise, make us an incredible team. We are humbled by the trust you have placed in us to steward your philanthropic goals over the last 12 years and look forward to expanding our community for years to come.



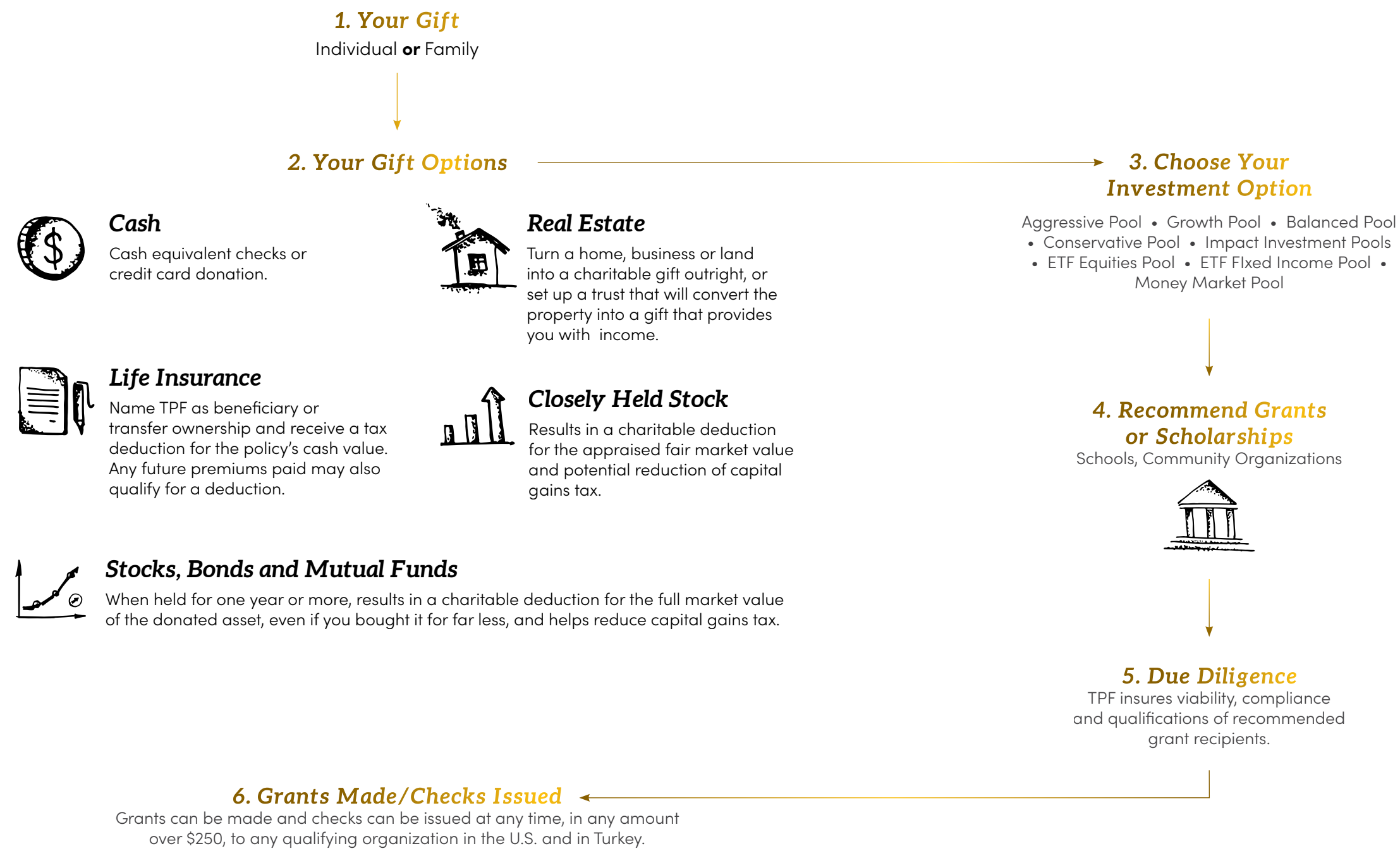

• CELEBRATION OF LEGACY •

*“Touching people’s lives – that’s the **legacy** people should aim for,”*

says Haldun Tashman, one of the founders of TPF and Chairman Emeritus.

Haldun Tashman is a visionary. When he came to the U.S. with a Fulbright scholarship to get his masters, he dreamt of accomplishing the ultimate ‘American dream,’ and later on, became a very successful entrepreneur. However, business success was not enough for him. He knew that giving back would provide him with a fulfilling life. Despite the belief that philanthropy was for the elite only, Haldun Tashman was interested in exploring ways to create a Turkish – American community foundation where everyone – middle class, rich, young and old – can come together and help people in need.

“We all, at one point in our lives, needed help or had received help from someone. Otherwise we wouldn’t have made it this far. So when we are able, we should also lend a hand to someone else,” says Haldun Tashman. His passion for giving back led him to launch TPF in 2007 with four other philanthropic pioneers. He had no idea at the time; the influence TPF would have in the community. In 12 years, TPF has earned the trust of more than

8,000 donors and helped support over 200 projects in Turkey and in the U.S. The legacy he created is beyond astonishing!

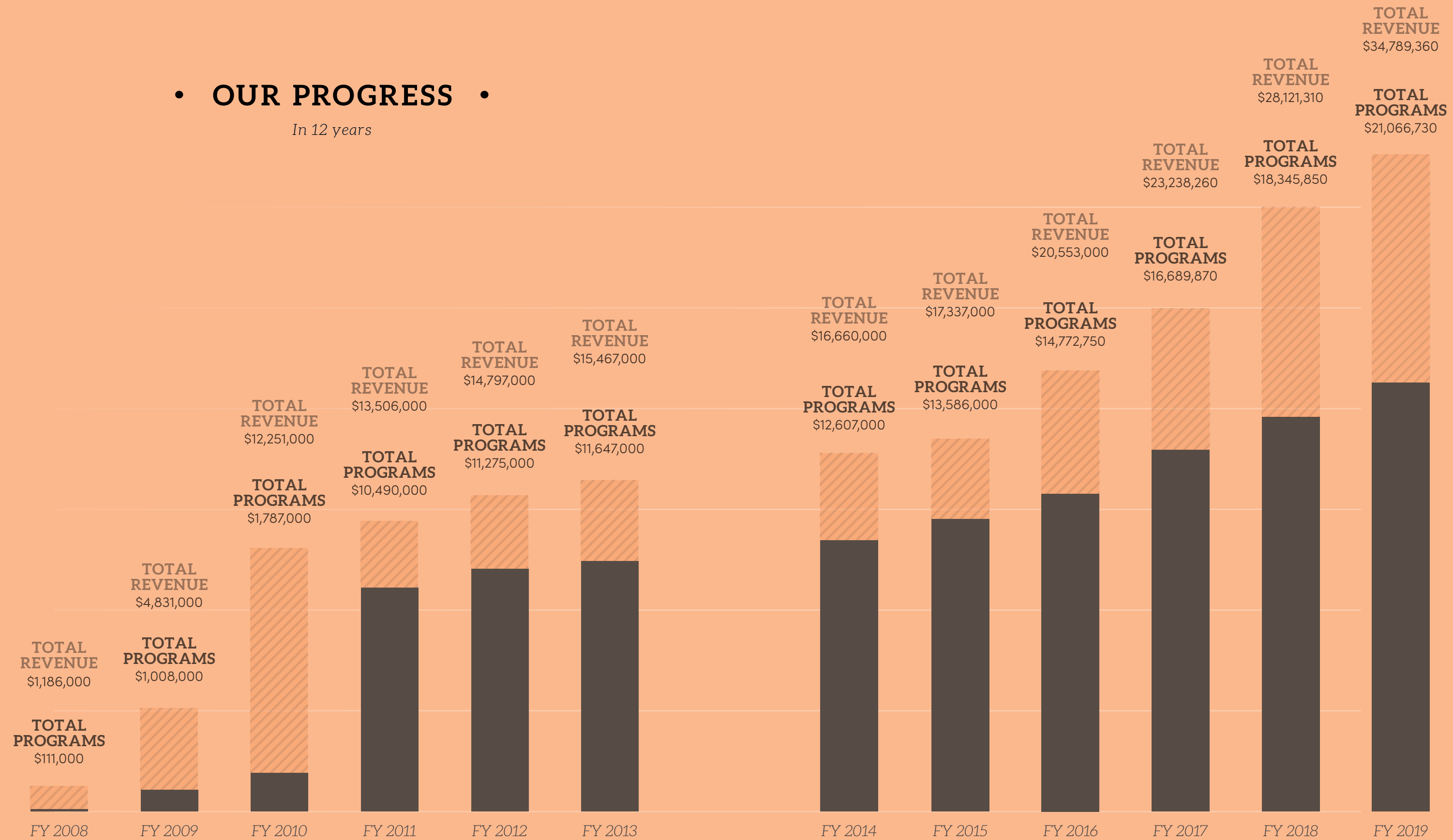
Tashman’s advice to young generations is to give whether it is money, knowledge or time – “making a difference in people’s lives and seeing it with your own eyes is perhaps the most satisfying thing a person can do,” he says. He also emphasizes that giving allows people to leave a **legacy** that many will remember. And, when people give, they inspire others to give.

As philanthropy is evolving so is the TPF community. Haldun Tashman’s vision has become a reality. His only wish now is to reach more people who have the capacity and propensity to give. This way they can make connections, support a cause they are passionate about and find meaning in their lives. He and his wife, Nihal, are grateful for the wonderful friends they have made because of TPF.

• LEGACY OF A COMMUNITY •

“When you educate a woman, you educate a community,”
says Onur Karayal, a physician, researcher,
and retired pharmaceutical executive.

About five years ago a group of thirty to forty successful men from all ages started getting together to socialize every month in New York. It was a time for them to unwind, eat, drink, and discuss sports and current events. It was just a casual thing they did every month until a meaningful purpose was added to these gatherings – a drive to make a difference in the lives of young women in Turkey.

Led by Berkin Koloğlu, Saffet Özbalcı, Serhan Seçmen and Onur Karayal, the group decided to form a giving circle at TPF. Since Onur has seen the impact of PAYDA, an organization supporting young women, first hand, he recommended working with them. This was the beginning of their giving circle journey. “Despite having lived in the U.S. for many years, our ties to Turkey remain strong. Given the relatively low level of philanthropic activity there, it made a lot of sense to direct our efforts towards projects in Turkey. It has been a rewarding experience to be able to use our network in the U.S. to fund such an important cause in our country of birth,” said Berkin on their decision to give back to Turkey.

PAYDA works with female students to build bridges between communities in Eastern and Western Turkey. Their impactful projects such as “Connecting Schools,” and “Circle of Hope” spoke to the interests of the whole group. For two and a half years, they held various fundraisers. In their first year, they raised close to \$18,000 and decided to fund a project in Mardin. The funds sponsored 250 young women in just one year! This ignited everyone involved. They wanted to support more students. In their second year, they raised more than \$35,000.

“We will continue to keep this project alive as long as possible because we know that educating a girl will not only help her but her whole community,” says Onur Karayal. What started as a few friends getting together turned into something amazing that all the group members are very proud of. The group is getting larger and becoming more ambitious with their vision. They continue to raise funds for PAYDA but would like to also explore other impactful projects that can support the livelihoods of young women in Eastern Turkey.





• A YOUNG VISIONARY CHANGING THE WORLD •

As technology continues to evolve and reshape our everyday lives, it stands to reason that the world of philanthropy would change along with it. At TPF we have a group of young trailblazers that advance altruism in more efficient and transparent ways than ever before. Erman is one of them!

Erman and his family are a true example of philanthropy in action, showing their dedication through their involvement and investment in the TPF community. It was inevitable that Erman, son of Murat and Ender Ağırnaslı, would someday want to start investing in philanthropic causes of his own. Erman has been exposed to the world of philanthropy at a young age. It all started with his grandparents helping those in need and later on continued with his parents' philanthropic involvement not only in the TPF community but in their local communities as well. Erman became a part of TPF's Young Philanthropists in 2012. He was, and has always been, enthused by his family's

passion for philanthropy, and longed to be the driving force behind a campaign to his very own interests. He picked 'Girls Education' and has used his network to spread awareness and raise money for women empowerment in Turkey, one of the most pressing issues. Just last year, he led Young Philanthropists of TPF and raised over \$15,000 to support schooling of tens of girls. More exciting initiatives are underway for the rest of 2019 and 2020 for Erman. And, he hopes to see more integration of philanthropy and technology to better the lives of women. "I believe that technology does have a profound effect on how philanthropy is done and I believe that we can all harness the power of technology to be more effective in our philanthropic efforts," he says.

We hope that Erman's enthusiasm and endless efforts to make a difference in the world will inspire many more to become philanthropists.

• INSPIRING OTHERS •

Emre's father grew up in a village in the province of Ankara. He didn't have access to the same opportunities kids his age had in cities. Once he moved to Ankara, he was determined to continue his education and became the first university graduate in his family. His father's story fascinated Emre and motivated him to follow in his footsteps. Emre always looked up to him and when his father decided to volunteer his time at ILKYAR Foundation, Emre also wanted to help.

Ilkyar Foundation's mission to educate and provide for students living in villages spoke to both Emre and his father. Emre has been supporting ILKYAR's mission for a few years already. In his first years he donated directly to specific projects of ILKYAR through TPF. Then, he questioned whether he could do more. With the guidance and direction of TPF he

decided to launch a matching campaign to encourage others to give to the project he wholeheartedly believes in. The results were amazing! Emre's actions moved many people. In the first year the matching campaign raised a total of \$40,000 in just one week. The second year matched the success of the first year bringing the total raised to \$80,000.

The funds helped village children go to science summer camps in Ankara.

There are different ways people take on **legacy**. Emre's father donates his time and money. Emre did not only want to give back but also get more people involved to increase the impact. That is Emre's **legacy**.



• SENA'S VISION EMPOWERS YOUNG TURKISH WOMEN •

George Schieber didn't know much about Turkey when he first met Sena Eken in 1976. She was a graduate student in economics at the University of Pittsburgh. After meeting Sena, George became interested in learning more about the culture, customs and values of Turkey, a country whose compelling history was hardly the centerpiece of America's primary and secondary education systems. Having seen a very evocative book review of Lord Kinross' epic book, *The Ottoman Centuries*, George became fascinated with Turkish history and began his own Turkey-focused book collection of 16th-19th century travel and costume books on Turkey and the Ottoman Empire.

Through Turkish relatives, friends, lectures, and books, George felt like he had discovered a new world very different than that of his relatively young native country. His fascination was enhanced during his trips to Turkey starting in 1976. The incredible history, architecture, hospitality, geographical setting, cuisine, handicrafts, and culture, in a modern Muslim democracy provided a real-world example of hope and potential for the political and economic future of the Middle East.

After Sena passed away in 2014, he wanted to do something meaningful in her name. Sena always appreciated how her education in Turkey and her graduate training in the U.S. provided her with the tools and opportunity to have a challenging international career at the IMF and as an Advisor to the Governor of the Central Bank of Turkey. To help create such opportunities for other deserving Turkish women, George launched the Sena Eken-Schieber Scholarship Fund at TPF to help Turkish women lacking the financial means to get graduate degrees in economics in the U.S. He engaged Sena's niece,

Esra Krause — a young lawyer, to assist him and TPF with this initiative. Esra is "proud to have seen the scholarship fund in the last three years support six successful economists in memory of my aunt. Providing the opportunity to these strong, intelligent and accomplished women is what makes it all worthwhile."

George, as both an economist and former international civil servant, voiced similar perspectives, and notes "It is such a great pleasure to be witnessing the growth, professional and personal development of these smart, energetic, compassionate, and dedicated young women. In this era of populism and nationalism, helping develop the social consciences and minds of the next generation of global professionals is indeed a worthy **legacy**." He hopes to continue supporting more young women from Turkey in the field of economics.



About Sena Eken-Schieber Economics Award

The Sena Eken-Schieber Economics Award is supported by the Eken-Schieber Scholarship Fund at Turkish Philanthropy Funds.

The fund was established by Sena's husband, George Schieber, to celebrate Sena Eken-Schieber's life, and continue her **legacy** as a pioneering international civil servant, Turkish Government official, economist, and a role model for many women.

The scholarship supports young women from Turkey from low-income families to pursue graduate degrees in economics in the United States.



• EXPANDING OPPORTUNITIES •

The Robert L. Long Nieman Fellowship at Harvard University honors the memory of journalist, filmmaker and news executive, Robert L. Long. Over many years, Long worked with journalists covering international news and was concerned with the issues facing journalism in a rapidly changing world. He committed his life to challenging and inspiring his colleagues to expand their intellectual curiosity and maintain the high standards and integrity of their profession. The fellowship was established by Joan Rebecca Siregar-Long, Long's widow, to honor his **legacy** by supporting journalists from a country he dearly loved. The fellowship is run in partnership with Harvard University's Nieman Foundation. The Robert L. Long Nieman Fellowship is open to journalists who are Turkish citizens. The fellowship is fully funded and supports fellows in two semesters of study at Harvard University. To apply please visit, <http://nieman.harvard.edu/fellowships/>.

Following Afşin Yurdakul, the first Robert L. Long Nieman fellow, Gülsin Harman became the second recipient of this annual Fellowship in 2019. Gülsin is a freelance reporter at The New York Times Istanbul Bureau. At Harvard University, she will be researching how new challenges to journalism impact democracy, with a focus on the link between disinformation and distrust of media in society.

BUILDING A COMMUNITY AROUND PHILANTHROPY

Nur Hamzaoğullari's family immigrated to Turkey from Bosnia in the early 1900s. She grew up listening to stories that emphasized the importance of generosity and helping individuals who are in need. Those stories stayed with her all her life.

After moving to the U.S. to get an MBA degree, she was impressed with the contagious culture of giving. Her philanthropic journey started when she volunteered at the Smithsonian Museum in Washington, DC while attending graduate school. As years passed her involvement turned into financial support as Nur and her husband's wealth grew. However, Nur still continued to volunteer as she likes to be engaged with projects she supports by giving her time as well. From the stories of her grandparents, she knows that philanthropy strengthens communities. When she had children, she made it a priority to instill the values of her grandparents to them. Now they often volunteer in museums, soup kitchens and cultural centers as a family. "They serve food and first hand learn the life stories and experiences of many parents who strive and work hard to feed their children and themselves. This creates empathy," she states which she believes is very much-needed in the world.

As her life progressed in the U.S., she had a constant desire to give back to her homeland, Turkey. That desire came true when she was introduced to TPF. In TPF, she found a way to give to many organizations and causes that are in need of support from education to women empowerment. Nur and her husband, Aziz, joined TPF's Founders Society shortly after their introduction to TPF. Nur later served as one of the board of directors of the organization. She wanted people to be aware of the opportunity to give back to Turkey through TPF in an impactful and transparent way. Therefore, she hosted events and dinners for the Turkish-American community in Boston to share her newly discovered passion.

Nur's opening line in all these gatherings has been "TPF is an efficient and effective partner to ensure that funds are channeled to wherever one likes to devote resources as a philanthropist. That's why I got involved with TPF and greatly enjoy my time there." She wholeheartedly believes in the work of TPF. She hopes to continue her efforts to get more community members working together to leverage community resources – both time and money – and in turn, improve the lives of many in Turkey.



• IT TAKES A VILLAGE! •



Investments by our community of philanthropists are crucial to changing the lives of youth. When Rüzgar learned that he was accepted to Cornell University, he was ecstatic and shared this joy with his father. Rüzgar’s father was both happy and sad by this news because he knew that he could not make his son’s dream come true financially. Rüzgar then started looking for other avenues to find funding for his education. A family friend agreed to pay for his semester at Cornell Tech as a loan. As his first semester was coming to an end, he was still unable to find any funding for his second semester. Right around that time he was introduced to TPF and asked for support. Our community immediately reacted to his need. Led by Mustafa Kemal Abadan and Murat Ağırnaslı, a fundraising campaign was launched. Murat and Mustafa rallied their family, colleagues and friends to raise funds to make Rüzgar’s dream come true.

Campaign raised more than \$28,000, the amount Rüzgar needed. “One day before the deadline of withdrawal from the university, the good news from TPF came. The letter from TPF to Cornell University allowed me to stay as a student here. If it was a day later, I would have been withdrawn from the school, and likely would not be able to come back. So I am here today, continuing to build my future, and live my dream because of you. Because of your contribution. And for that, I am eternally grateful,” says Rüzgar. He continues, “the scholarship allowed me to get an internship this summer at Anheuser Busch InBev (Global), and allowed me to continue pursuing my passion in technology and innovation.”

We believe that quality education puts young people on the path to success in life and grateful to donors who enable this path.



• A ROLE MODEL IN PHILANTHROPY •

“Both Ziya and I grew up in families with a deep sense of civic duty and responsibility to our communities. So giving was not something that was foreign to either of us,” says Nakiye Boyacigiller, one of TPF’s Founders Society Members and a Board Member. Nakiye and her late husband, Ziya, shared the same values. They started giving back early in life with small amounts. Their giving grew as their net worth grew. Their passion has always been supporting women’s education in Turkey and their giving reflected that passion from giving scholarships to supporting fellowship programs.

“We have started thinking of our legacy very early on in our lives with Ziya” says Nakiye and continues “the sterling example of Haldun and Nihal Tashman and their ‘give while you live’ philosophy also influenced our giving and encouraged us to join TPF’s Founders Society. The transparent giving platform TPF offers is exceptional and we wanted to be a part of this wonderful legacy.”

TPF’s professional and fiscally responsible management gave Nakiye the confidence she needed to also open a DAF in honor of Ziya Boyacigiller, whom she lost in 2014. The memorial fund currently underwrites the participation of two young entrepreneurs (one woman, one man) in the Turkish Entrepreneurship Foundation’s Fellows Program. In doing so Nakiye and her daughters are continuing Ziya’s legacy of mentoring young entrepreneurs while also supporting a TPF partner. Nakiye also backs several other TPF partners and serves on the boards of BUVAK (Boğaziçi University Foundation) and DLD (Change Leaders Association).

Nakiye’s hope for the future is that her children, grandchildren and students learn by her and her husband’s example and be caring and responsible individuals. These values she says are best learned by seeing from your elders. “I feel a personal responsibility to try and contribute to a better world. I know that my children definitely see that and hope my students do as well. That is my greatest legacy.”

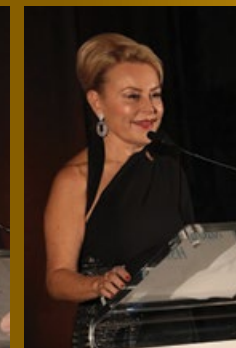

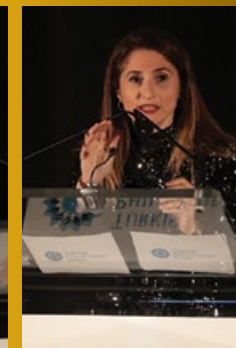

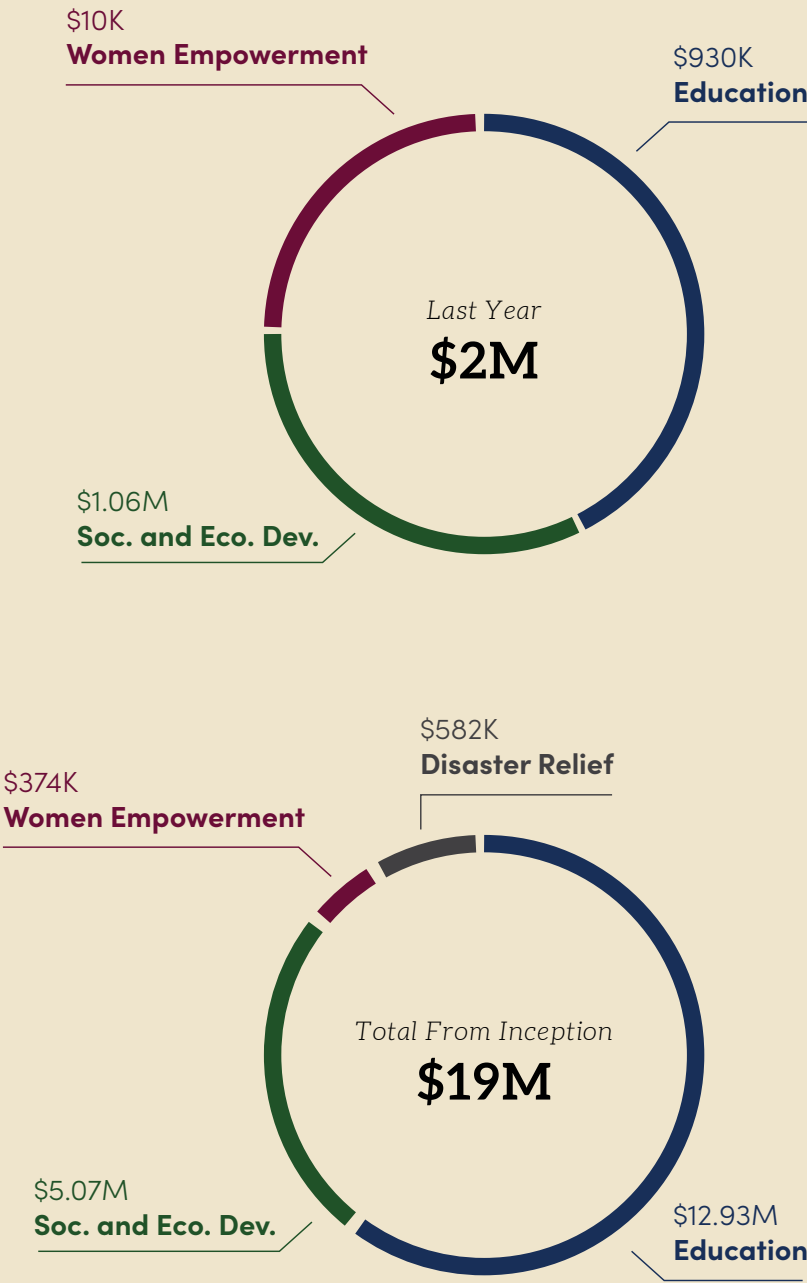

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

Turkish Philanthropy Funds takes great pride in providing clear, transparent information about our investment management and performance, our financial position, and our administrative fees. Our board of directors has developed investment policies and guidelines that provide for prudent asset management. An Investment Committee, comprised of board members and volunteers knowledgeable in the investment field, oversees the investment activities of TPF.

INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT

Effective and strategic investment of assets is one of our key responsibilities. Turkish Philanthropy Funds investment philosophy is to invest charitable funds prudently that support both growth and grantmaking. TPF’s investment portfolio is made up of diversified pools managed by specialized investment managers.

1. **Guidance:** With our Investment Committee overseeing the management of TPF’s investment program, we rely on seasoned investment and business professionals drawn from our Board of Directors and the larger community.
2. **Transparency:** TPF consistently works to enhance its reporting, assuring that donors understand our overall strategy for managing long-term and short-term assets. TPF communicates frequently with donor to make it easy to obtain detailed information on our financial position, portfolio performance, administrative fees and policies. All audits and returns are available on our website.

3. **Choice:** Starting October 1, 2019, TPF partners with Morgan Stanley Global Impact Funding Trust, Inc. (MS GIFT) for the purpose of establishing donor-advised fund accounts at MS GIFT. MS GIFT is an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and is the sponsor of TPF’s donor advised fund program. As the sponsor of TPF’s DAFs, MS GIFT manages investment of DAFs. Funds may be invested in one of eight investment pools as well as a money market pool shown below. Discover these investment pool options that are available to suit various objectives (numbers below are as of September 1, 2019.):

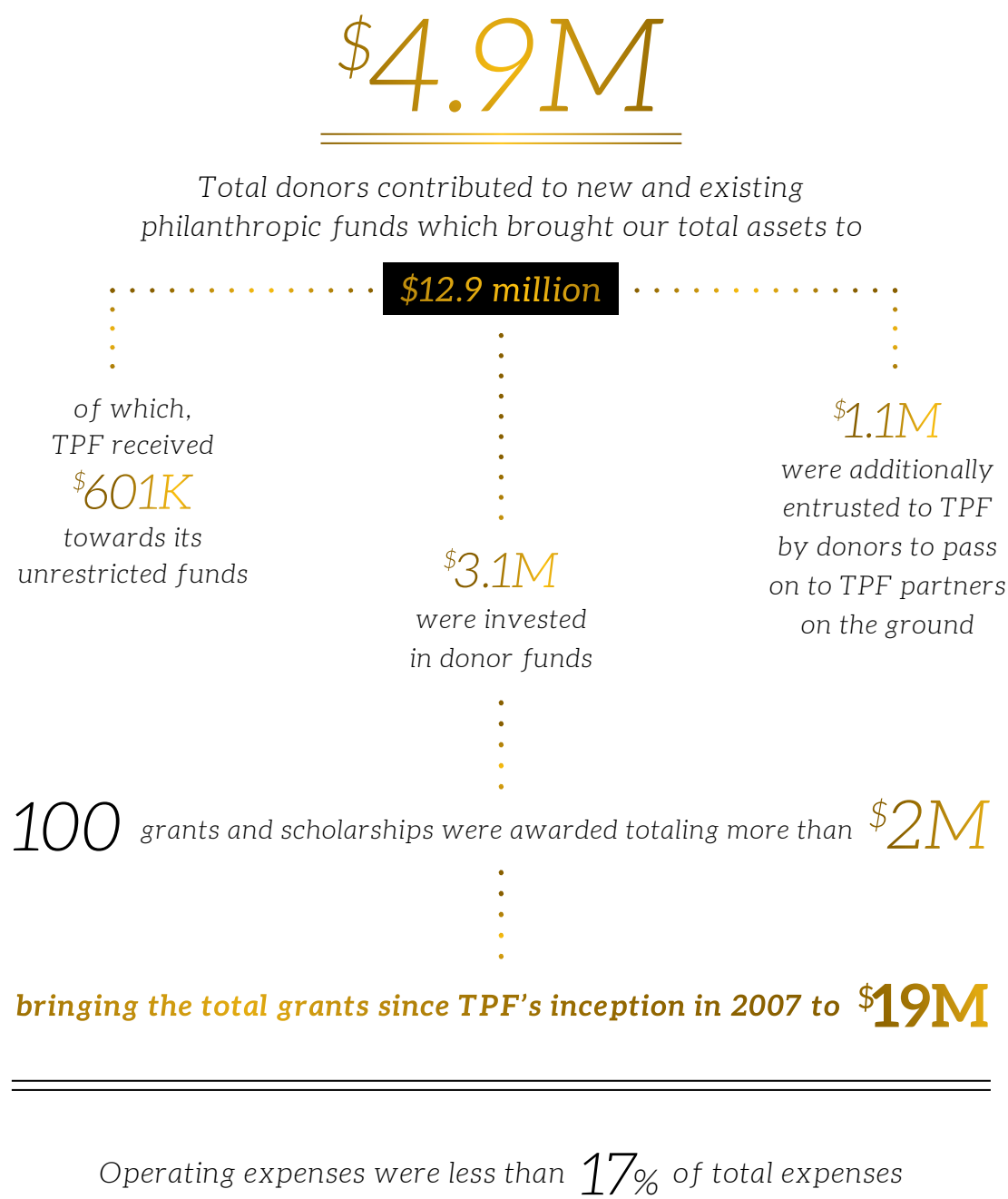
