

# 2 Leadership Letter

Dear Donors, Partners and Friends,

Turkish Philanthropy Funds is 11 years old this year. When we began this journey, the world was a different place.

What inspired us to start this foundation more than a decade ago still inspires us today: We believe this is an important moment to come together as a community to celebrate the many voices in our society. Our impact lies in our collective capability. Today, TPF has invested nearly \$18 million in more than 50 organizations working across 70+ cities in the United States and Turkey. As we look back, we're amazed and humbled by how many individuals have committed to give and get involved; and by partners on the ground that are relentless in their pursuit of excellence to provide for their communities for the long term.

This annual report invites you to hear the stories of our donors, grantee partners, board members, advisors, and corporate partners. Each time they come together, they ignite the power to imagine, the power to dream and the power to see how working together creates a better community for everyone.

We have seen how single organizations with the right values and support can, in time, enable widespread systemic change. Ashoka Foundation's "Changemaker Classrooms," an investment in instilling analytical skills in children, has not only taught problem-solving and leadership to many children but it has helped many teachers employ non-traditional teaching methods in classrooms to teach the 21st century learning skills. Entrepreneurship Foundation "Girişimcilik Vakfı" has provided more than 25 fellowships through TPF's support to young entrepreneurs. By doing so it is supporting the growth of a new entrepreneurial culture in Turkey and showing how this can lead to a career. Maya Foundation (Maya Vakfı) was just an idea five years ago. Today, it provides mental, physical and academic support to more than 500 children and their families. As the organization brings together more than 300 volunteers from 10+

countries everyday it proves the power of working together to create a better community for everyone. Young Guru Academy has used new discoveries to build a "smart cane," WeWALK has enabled millions of visually impaired individuals to fully participate in every day life. ILKYAR, Çağdaş Yaşamı Destekleme Derneği (CYDD) and Darüşşafaka Society have made educational opportunities more inclusive all around Turkey.

And, this is only some of what we have been a part of... In total, thousands of people have benefited from TPF's investments last year.

Many of our partners on the ground not only have succeeded in transforming thousands of lives, but they are contributing to a different narrative about how we can address social challenges. Each grant is a story of opportunity, resilience, persistence and hope. Each grant has the chance to create more inclusion and impact lives in significant ways. And, it's you who make it happen.

Once again we are honored of what we have accomplished together. 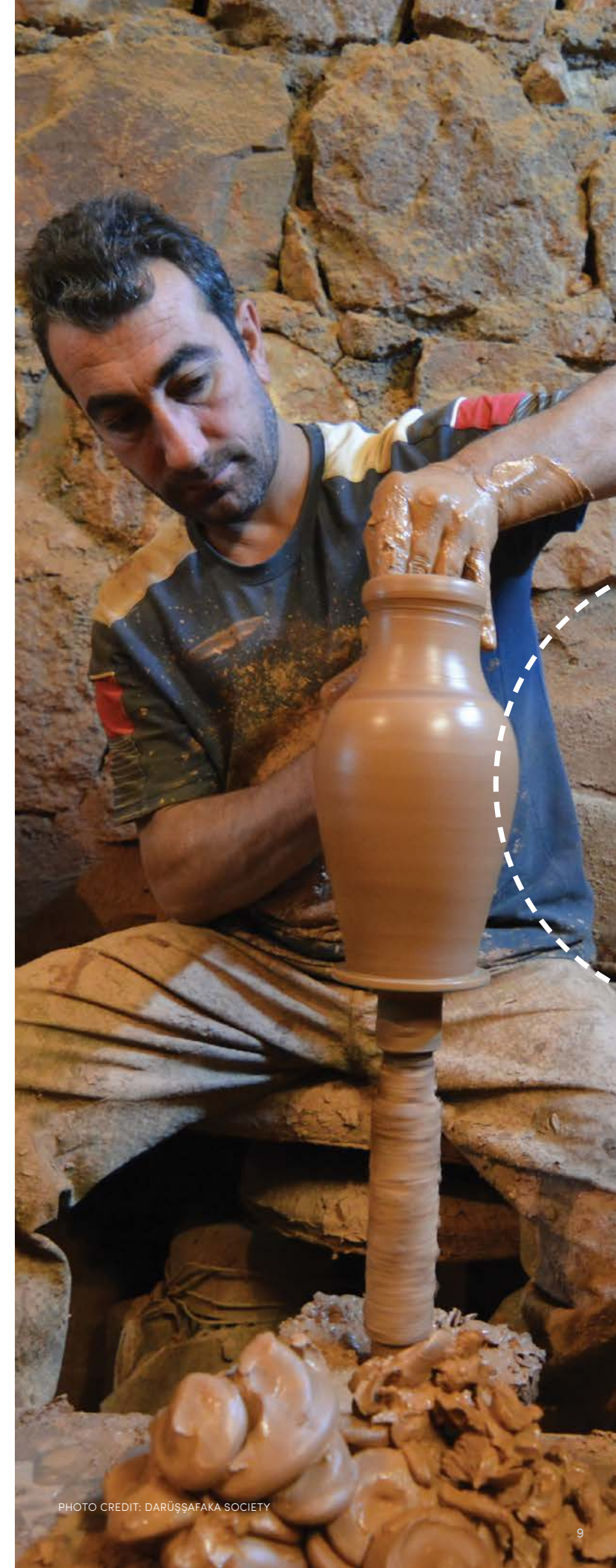

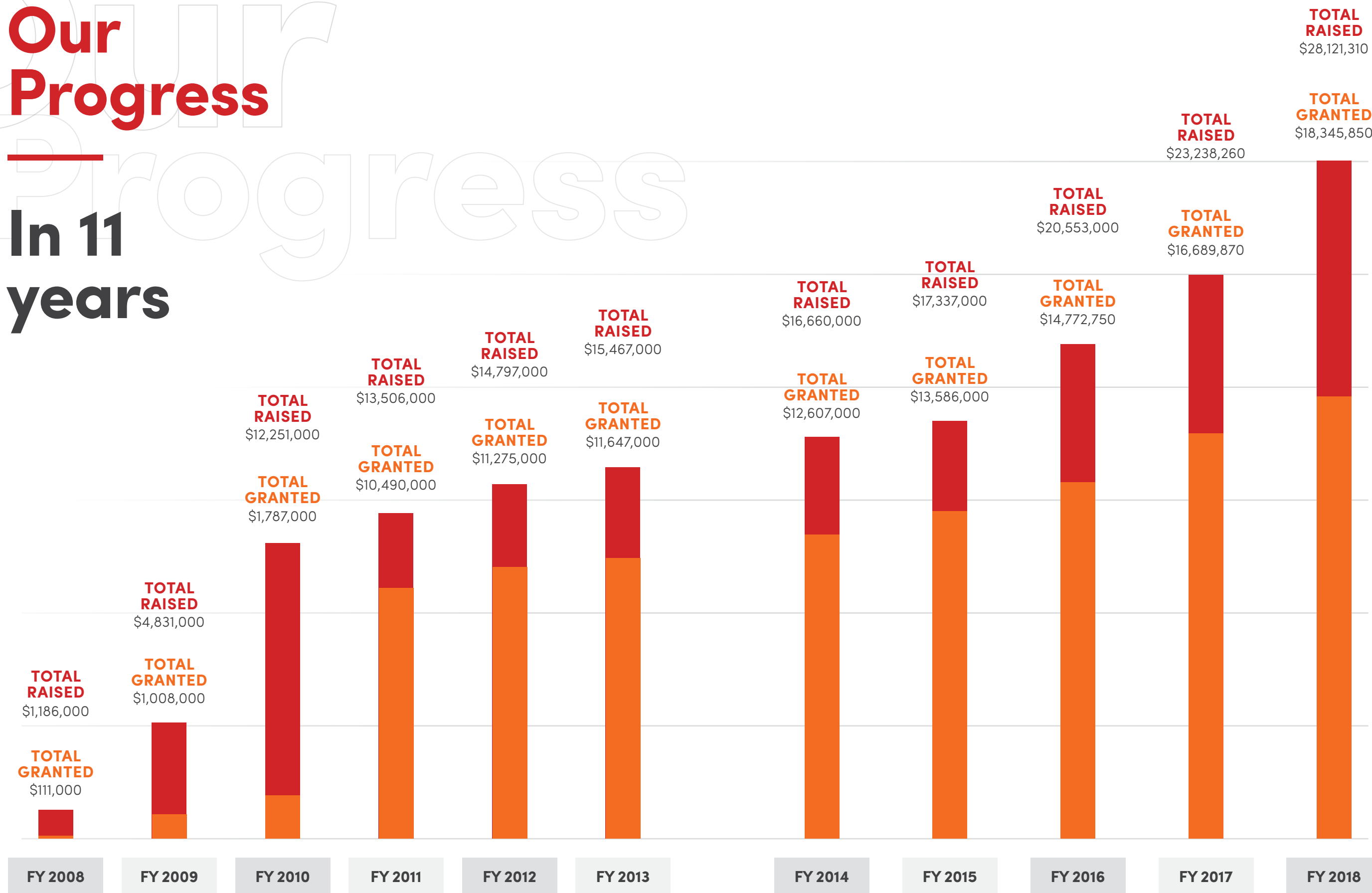

# A Great Source of Inspiration and Courage

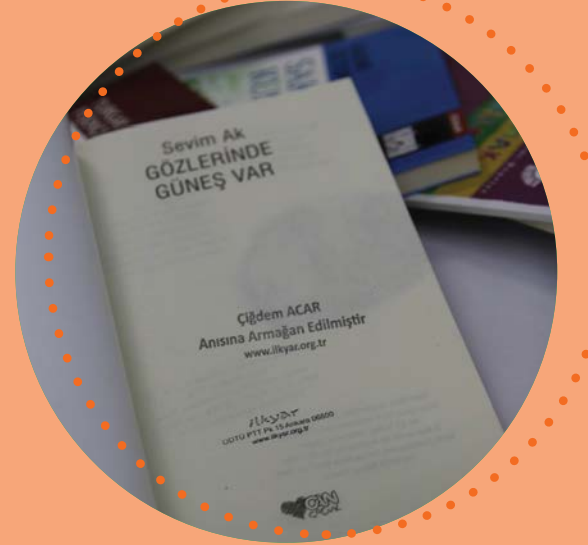
## Çiğdem Acar touched the lives of many people.

Her whole life she explored opportunities for collaboration to create unlikely intersections, to better address societal issues and to provide a resource where every voice is acknowledged and considered. We are very honored that TPF has helped to continue her legacy through a memorial fund that creates opportunities for children in Turkey so they can be heard and recognized. Three libraries in the cities of Kastamonu, Sivas and Çorum have been established by İLKİYAR. With the remaining funds, a Çiğdem Acar Memorial Fund has been created to sustain her enduring legacy. Her family will continue to manage the memorial fund and determine which projects to support in the years to come.

In 2007 when Çiğdem started Bridges of Hope Project, the vision behind the idea was very powerful: Çiğdem wanted to go beyond the income and class disparities and give all children in Turkey an equal opportunity in education. Reaching out to everyone in her network and connecting unlikely people to each other, Çiğdem created a community– from İstanbul to Ağrı to New York. Her efforts threw into relief the stark reality of how geography – not talent – disproportionately determines destiny. Children from disadvantaged communities are physically cut off from the conditions that lead to more opportunities and she wanted to give them a chance.



She knew this was possible. She sat with children in Afyon, mothers in Van and teachers in Malatya – people from all backgrounds whose destiny is more a factor of where they live than their genetic code. Though living radically different lives, all of them had one thing in common: they aspired to create better lives for themselves and their families.

Çiğdem understood that these children and their families knew what they needed. Her role was to help clear the path and unlock the resources to propel them forward. These children needed to be inspired and then to transform their aspirations into reality.

That's when she decided to build libraries through Bridges of Hope Project. She believed that "this would enfranchise each and every child with a passport to the limitless world of knowledge, learning and critical thinking." Over ten years, Bridges of Hope Project built close to 150 libraries all around Turkey. These efforts have allowed close to 80,000 children to access new libraries and nearly 100,000 books.

# Connecting and Empowering Communities

---

Since day one, our entire approach to philanthropy is about building a community based on shared values and providing a platform that serves all of us. With this belief, we continue to connect people and organizations in the US with organizations in Turkey.

One of those organizations we have connected is Blossom Hill Foundation in the US and Maya Foundation in Turkey. Through their partnership, TPF was able to channel \$50,000 to Maya Foundation's Project Lift project and provide trauma training to teachers, counsellors, families and school staff.

## **‘Music unites,’**

says Nurdan Çivi.

It united a community in California for a greater purpose than just entertainment. Nurdan, inspired by her mother-in-law who volunteers for CYDD in Turkey, organized a fundraising concert with her band to support girls’ education. For years, her family had been supporting educational causes but this time, she wanted to join forces with others in the community to make a greater impact.

Besides raising money, her event united a community around an exciting cause. “This is what building a community around philanthropy is,” she says. “I am proud of what we were able to accomplish and I hope the turn out will be even greater next year.”





# Power of Collaborative Impact

We grow more ambitious in our desire for impact and this is why we are always looking for opportunities to leverage resources for our partners on the ground. Thus when one of our donors approached us to make a donation to İlkyar Foundation, we recommended doubling his impact by launching a campaign, where all the donations received in one day is matched with donation offered by our donor. İlkyar Foundation happily obliged to this recommendation and raised more than \$20,000 in one day. With the matching gift, İlkyar was able to receive more than \$40,000 and give the gift of education to many village children in Turkey.

On May 3rd, 2018, we honored the contributions of Güler Sabancı to education, along with Columbia University. Güler Sabancı is a well-known business leader who has a distinguished legacy through her philanthropic efforts. She is a champion of education in Turkey, through various efforts to increase quality of education and serves as the Chairwoman of Sabancı University. # The Robert L. Long Nieman Fellowship

## — at Harvard University

### SUPPORTING THE WORK OF EXCEPTIONAL TURKISH JOURNALISTS

Afşin Yurdakul became the first Robert L. Long Nieman Fellow.

#### 1. Tell us a little about yourself.

I'm a television journalist. I host a daily news show and a weekly current affairs show on Turkey's Haberturk News Network. In the past, I was the network's chief foreign editor, responsible for our daily international news coverage. Before joining Haberturk, I covered Turkey and the Middle East for a variety of Turkish and American publications including Foreign Policy and The New Republic. I studied at Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism in New York.

#### 2. How do you feel about being the First Robert L. Long Nieman Fellow?

I'm happy and excited. It's an honor and a responsibility. The fellowship was named after Robert L. Long, a fellow journalist, who cared deeply about our profession. I am humbled to be the first Turkish journalist to be awarded this fellowship and wanted to thank Joan Rebecca Long and Turkish Philanthropy Funds for taking the initiative to create such a program at the Nieman Foundation at Harvard.

#### 3. What inspired you to do a research on Syrian refugee crisis during your fellowship?

I have been following the story closely since the war broke out. It is one of the most pressing humanitarian issues of our time. Millions had to flee the war, and seek refuge elsewhere. Roughly 3.5 million Syrians now live in Turkey. Host countries reacted differently to the crisis. Some viewed this humanitarian catastrophe solely through a security lens. Others tried to lend a helping hand. The magnitude of the crisis presented the international community with an unprecedented challenge. In my research at Harvard, I want to focus on the economic and social integration of refugees in Turkey and other host communities. It is crucial for societies to work on a long-term, comprehensive policy framework regarding this issue in order to avoid instability in the long run.

#### 4. How would this fellowship empower you professionally and change your perspective in the field of Journalism? What would be the impact of the network and resources you will access at Harvard University?

Harvard offers a wealth of resources. In addition to conducting research, I will have the opportunity to learn from people who have hands-on experience in this field. During my fellowship year, I also hope to expand my knowledge on how our industry is transforming. The Nieman Foundation is one of the finest platforms in the world dealing with issues in journalism. I hope to take full advantage of being a Nieman fellow to engage with news leaders and innovators to discuss the future of journalism.

#### 6. At this day and age, what do you see as the role of journalists?

Journalists are facing various problems, our industry is facing various problems, and this is a global phenomenon. The industry is under pressure to invent, adapt and come up with a new business model for the future, while our core responsibility as newsmakers stays the same: telling stories with integrity. Good journalism is essential for a healthy democracy. Citizens need access to accurate information to make sound decisions. With smart phones, anyone can snap a picture or tweet now. But it's a mistake to consider that journalism. Our job is to verify, to provide context, and to connect the dots for our audiences. In an increasingly complex world, the role of journalists is even more critical.

#### 7. What is your recommendation to young people who are thinking about going into this field?

Read, write, listen deeply. Prepare to work hard, and work well under deadline pressures. Don't get into journalism to be popular. Don't get carried away with the fame or exposure. Journalism is a profession that comes with an intellectual responsibility to the public, and I encourage young people to go into this field if they feel strongly about it.

"I am extremely grateful that Afşin Yurdakul is the first distinguished recipient of the Robert L. Long Nieman Fellowship. honors the memory of journalism, filmmaker and news executive Robert L. Long. Over many years, Long worked with journalists covering international news and was concerned with the issues facing journalism in a rapidly changing world. He committed his life to challenging and inspiring his colleagues to expand their intellectual curiosity and maintain the high standards and integrity of their profession. The fellowship was established by Joan Rebecca Siregar-Long, Long's widow, to honor his legacy by supporting journalists from a country he dearly loved. The fellowship is run in partnership with Harvard University's Nieman Fellowship program. The Robert L. Long Nieman Fellowship is open to journalists who are Turkish citizens. # Imagining A New Future

Sena Eken Schieber has been a very successful international development professional all her life. Her life story is very inspirational. And, for the last three years her life has inspired and lit up the path of many young women from Turkey.

This year Beril Yalçinkaya and Bahar Zafer were awarded the Sena Eken Schieber Scholarship Award, and they are on their way to making their dreams come true.

“My dream is to become a development economist,” Beril says. While working for a global technology company in İstanbul, Beril started questioning her aspirations in life and started a search for a higher purpose. “That’s when I started to think about how I can give back while also being a productive member of our society.” Her research introduced her to Sena Eken Schieber. “I was impressed with her background and her accomplishments. Her story inspired me tremendously

and I started dreaming about getting the scholarship and studying Economics in the US.”

Bahar who came to Turkey as a refugee from Bulgaria knows how education in the US can empower her to be the best person she can be. “Education was what made the changes in my and in my family’s life. It is the most important empowering tool in the life of a refugee woman.” She aspires to one-day give back to young women, herself. “Sena is not only inspiring for women like us but a great role model. I have told myself many times, if she did it so can you.”

Sena Eken Scheiber’s story and life-long wish to help smart young women with less means has materialized in the stories of these young women. They’re posed to be successful in their graduate work and step into the real world to follow their dreams. We know they will succeed!

# Advocating for Others

Laura Prusoff, an American Culinary photographer and a resident of Capadocia, did not want to turn her back on the Syrian refugees living in her adopted city. Coming from a line of refugees herself from Russia and Germany, she wanted to do something. At first, she had some setbacks. Yet, Laura and her team, Ruth Lockwood and Leonie Zikos, were determined to lead change and provide new opportunities to the community in Ortahisar, Capadocia.



## Together, they rolled up their sleeves.

Ruth was involved in raising local funds and donations. Leonie donated her time and started various projects. Laura financed opening of a Community Center. The center is now home to different projects such as: aid assistance, psychosocial support, Food Diplomacy, and a Syrian School Project which was launched under her newly established non-profit organization, Helping Hands Turkey. She along with her team brought together 100 Syrian and Turkish children together to build puppets, write and create their own stories and perform in front of a diverse audience. They also had Turkish and Syrian women collaborating to showcase traditional dishes as part of the famous CAPPADOX Festival. The center also offers art therapy workshops, helping children build character and self-esteem. All of these efforts are part of a larger

effort to build a community where there is acceptance, respect for one another and appreciation of differences and similarities.

## TPF has become a vehicle for Laura's personal philanthropy.

She was attracted by the commitment to transparency and trustworthiness that has helped to create a community of philanthropists like herself and believed that a platform like TPF would help her achieve her goal of helping refugees. TPF and Laura are also working together to search for additional resources. She has now become part of our community.



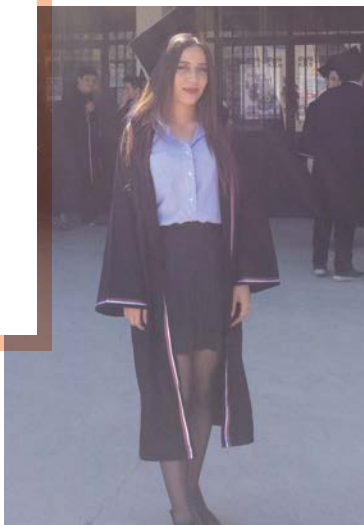


# Our Stars are Shining

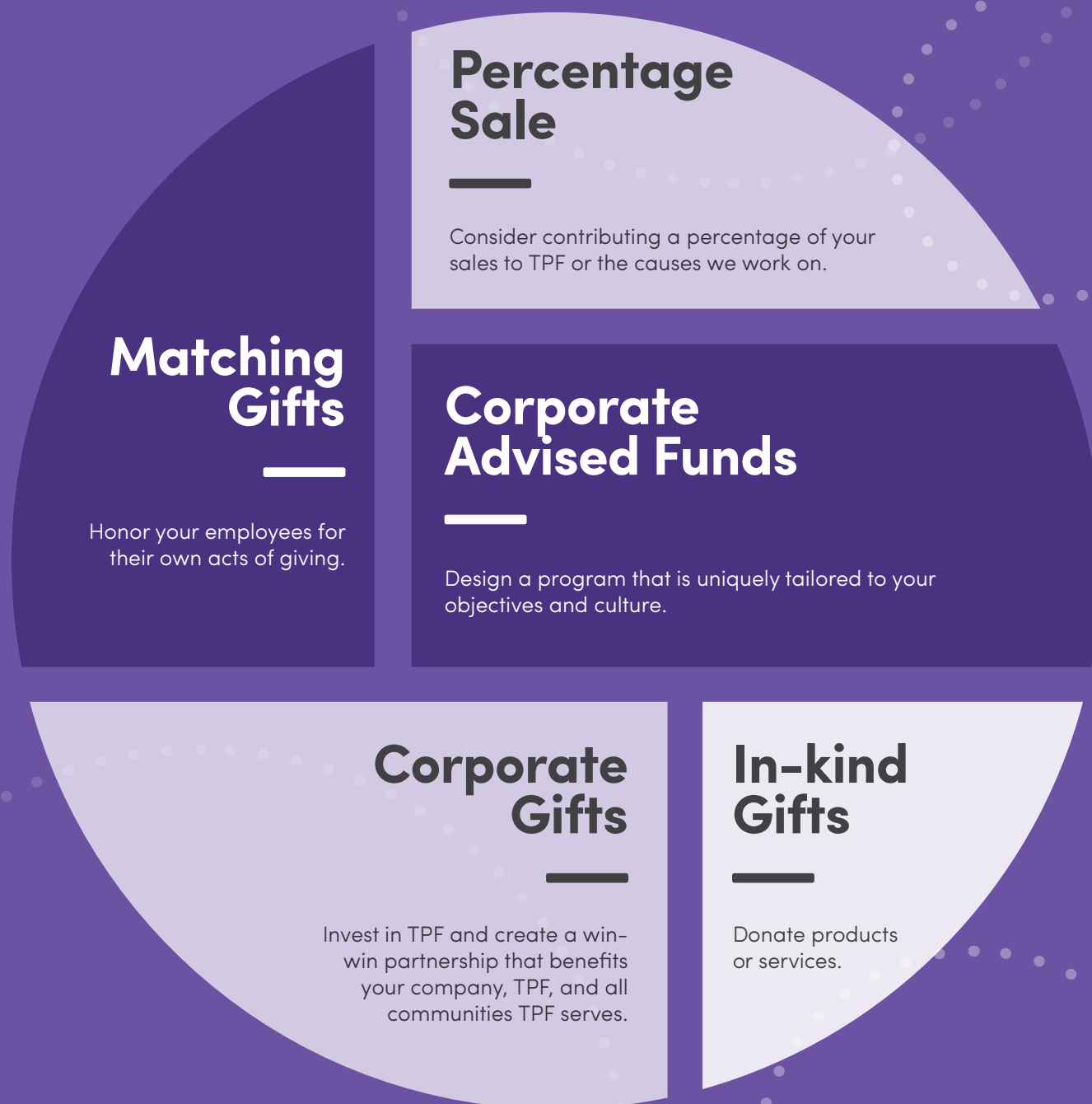
