LEADERSHIP LETTER

Dear Friends, Supporters, and Partners of Turkish Philanthropy Funds,

very year at Turkish Philanthropy Funds, we are reminded of a simple but profound truth: behind every gift is a story. Some begin with hardship, others with hope. Some are about honoring a loved one's memory, others about creating opportunities that did not exist before. Taken together, these stories remind us of the power of generosity to transform not only individual lives but entire communities. And those stories do not stand alone. They are lifted, multiplied, and transformed by the collective spirit of our community. That is the heartbeat of TPF — connecting donors, partners, and communities across Türkiye, the U.S., and beyond in a shared purpose of lasting change.

This year, those stories were once again extraordinary. We saw Özlenen Kalav, one of TPF's earliest visionaries, weave her own family legacy into her philanthropic journey — proving that caring for loved ones and caring for community are not separate, but part of the same story of generosity. We saw Elmira Bayraslı and her siblings establish a memorial fund in honor of their father, turning remembrance into impact and ensuring that his values continue to inspire future generations.

We witnessed young women like **Sıla, Ece, and Nagehan**, recipients of the Sena Eken-Schieber Economics Award, step boldly into a field, once closed to women, carrying forward Sena Eken Schieber's legacy of courage and excellence. We celebrated scholars like **Selin, Nursena, and Çağla**, whose journeys were made possible by the Changemaker Scholarship Fund and whose dreams now reach stages from Manhattan's concert halls to the classrooms of Columbia University. We championed **Esra, Revşen, and Yasemin**, young women supported by our partner PAYDA, whose determination and mentorship helped them become the first doctors and lvy League students in their families. And through programs like AKUT Spor Kulübü, we saw how sports can empower youth in disadvantaged regions, instilling resilience, teamwork, and hope for the future.

These stories remind us that scholarships are not just individual achievements. They are **expressions of community philanthropy**. Each donor who contributes,

each mentor who guides, each partner who supports becomes part of a shared circle of generosity that turns one student's dream into a legacy for many. Together, these collective investments ensure that talent is not defined by circumstance but nurtured by community.

In Hatay, Adiyaman, and across the earthquake-affected region, we saw recovery take root in many forms. From the **Hatay Symphony Orchestra** helping young musicians find healing in every note, to the Arsuz Community Center transformed into a hub for youth art and resilience, to women weaving new livelihoods through the **Mutfakna Kitchen** in Gaziantep — each grant became more than aid. It became a seed of renewal. With **KODA**, we stood beside rural teachers, equipping them with tools and mentorship to support children in village schools deeply affected by disaster. And with **Dört Ayaklı Şehir**, we extended compassion to the most vulnerable—providing food, care, and dignity to street animals, reminding us that a resilient community must care for all living beings.

These efforts show that recovery is not the work of any one organization or donor alone. It is the **work of a philanthropic community.** Together with our donors and partner NGOs, we created a web of support that turned tragedy into possibility. This is the essence of community philanthropy: each contribution, no matter its size, connects to others to create an impact far greater than what any of us could achieve alone.

These stories were made possible because of YOU. Together, we raised more than \$8.5 million this year and invested in 182 grants and scholarships across disaster recovery, education, women's empowerment, arts and culture, health, and economic opportunity. Each grant was more than a number. It was a door opened, an opportunity provided, a future reimagined.

TPF Gala 2025 reminded us of what we can achieve when generosity and vision unite. In one evening, \$2.7 million was raised, with part of the proceeds dedicated to scholarships that will shape tomorrow's leaders. The highlight of the evening was the presentation of the Philanthropic Leadership Award, a biennial recognition of extraordinary individuals and families whose generosity has created lasting change. More than an award, it is a bridge of continuity, passed from one recipient to the next, carrying forward a living legacy of leadership in philanthropy.

This year, we were **honored to celebrate the Özmen Family.** Their commitment to education, opportunity, and community empowerment has transformed countless lives and continues to inspire across generations. Even more meaningful was that the award was presented by past recipient, **Hamdi Ulukaya**, whose own journey has redefined what it means to give boldly.

In that passing of recognition, we saw a powerful truth: philanthropy is not just about one family, one gift, or one moment. It is about a **community of givers,** each building upon the other, weaving individual acts of generosity into a collective tradition of giving. This chain of impact—where one story uplifts the

next — embodies the very essence of community philanthropy. It is in these shared moments that we are reminded that our strength lies not only in what each of us gives, but in how we come together to build something larger than ourselves: a tradition of generosity that endures and a community that thrives.

We are deeply grateful for every donor, partner, and friend who makes this work possible. Your belief fuels our mission and sustains our vision of creating a living tradition of community philanthropy, where each gift builds upon another.

Looking ahead, we dare to imagine even more. 

HEALING LIVES, EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES

or Dr. Tamer Seçkin, everything began with a simple but powerful passion: to heal. That passion grew into a lifelong journey in medicine - one that led him to become a pioneering specialist in endometriosis and a champion for women's health worldwide. Today, Dr. Seçkin, Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Zucker School of Medicine at Hofstra University, and one of the most prominent voices advocating for women living with endometriosis, is internationally recognized not only for his surgical expertise but also for bringing visibility to a condition that has long been overlooked. As the co-founder of the Endometriosis Foundation of America (EndoFound), he has educated thousands of physicians, advocated for early diagnosis, and inspired patients to speak openly about their experiences. His work goes beyond others in the field. With a strong commitment to research and scientific advancement, he partnered with Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory to establish the Seçkin Endometriosis Research Center for Women's Health. Through this initiative, Dr. Seçkin is fostering groundbreaking discoveries to better understand the disease's molecular and genetic mechanisms – driving progress toward earlier detection, improved treatments, and ultimately, a cure. His dedication and advocacy has reshaped the conversation around women's health, ensuring that countless women reclaim not only their health, but also their joy and confidence in life.

Alongside his medical career, Dr. Seçkin has embraced many roles: devoted husband to Elif Seçkin, proud father of three, founder, teacher, mentor, and author of The Doctor Will See You Now.

In recognition of his contributions, he received the Ellis Island Medal of Honor, a symbol of his dedication to service and impact beyond borders. These accomplishments tell the story of a life shaped by empathy, resilience, and a commitment to helping others thrive.



That same spirit carries into his philanthropy. Healing, for Dr. Seçkin, extends far beyond the walls of his practice. It is also about healing communities, lifting people up, creating lasting opportunities, and empowering those who are too often overlooked. His connection to Turkish Philanthropy Funds reflects this vision — to make things better. He has known TPF's Chairman Emeritus, Haldun Tashman, since his youth. Their friendship and shared values deepened over decades in the United States, where Dr. Seçkin has remained closely tied to the Turkish-American community. He has been part of TPF's story since its earliest days as a Founders Society member, witnessing its growth from a small circle of friends into a vibrant community of thousands united by compassion and action.

Through his Donor Advised Fund at TPF, Dr. Seçkin champions causes that mirror his personal and professional journey: advancing women's health, expanding education, and promoting gender equality. Just as he has challenged silence and stigma in medicine, he directs his philanthropy toward breaking barriers, ensuring access, and creating new possibilities for those who might otherwise be left behind. Since joining TPF's Board in June, he has amplified this impact — bringing the same strategic thinking, compassion, and vision that distinguish his medical career to guide TPF's future.



For Dr. Seçkin, giving is not separate from his life's work — it is a continuation of it. His story shows how leadership in one field can resonate far beyond it, inspiring others to take bold steps for change. It reflects a belief that one person's dedication can ripple outward, improving lives and shaping futures. At its heart, his story reminds us that philanthropy is an expression of who we are and what we believe the world can become.

We are honored to count Dr. Seçkin among our TPF family—not only as a leader in medicine and philanthropy but also as a visionary who reminds us that healing, in all its forms, is one of the most powerful legacies we can create.



Perfect for individuals, families, and companies who want a simple yet powerful way to organize their philanthropy.



Scholarship Funds

Education changes lives.

you empower the next generation by
opening doors to higher education for
talented students with financial need.
You define the criteria such as field
of study, merit, or leadership qualities
and TPF manages the selection and
administration, ensuring your gift fuels
opportunity for years to come.

Designated Funds

DR. ŞEVKET TURGUT NEŞE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Late Dr. Şevket Turgut Nese graduated from Istanbul University Medical School and spent most of his life in the United States. He wished his wealth would be used for a good cause in Türkiye. TPF created a permanent charitable fund under Dr. Nese's name to ensure that his name and his legacy continued forever. Now, scholarships are given to medical students at his alma mater, Istanbul University. Dr. Nese's initial contribution will be invested over time through the power of endowment. The return will continue to provide scholarships for medical students in Türkiye for many years.



THE ABADAN AWARDS

Inspired by his parents, Mustafa Kemal Abadan established a scholarship fund, The Abadan Awards, at Koç University to encourage early-career scholars to pursue and/or complete their post-graduate studies in Türkiye or abroad. The awards are administered by Koç University and alternate each year between Dr. Yavuz Abadan Constitutional Law Award for studies in constitutional law and; Dr. Nermin Abadan-Unat Social Science Award in social studies with a particular focus on women's research.



THE ROBERT L. LONG NIEMAN FELLOWSHIP

The fellowship honors the memory of journalist, filmmaker, and news executive Robert L. Long in partnership with Harvard University's Nieman Fellowship program. Over many years, Long worked with journalists covering international news and was concerned with journalism's issues in a rapidly changing world. He committed his life to challenge and inspiring his colleagues to expand their intellectual curiosity and maintain their profession's high standards and integrity. Joan Rebecca Siregar-Long established Long's widow's fellowship to honor his **legacy** by supporting journalists from a country he dearly loved. The Robert L. Long Nieman Fellowship is open to journalists who are Turkish citizens. The fellowship is fully funded and supports fellows in two semesters of study at Harvard University.



ATTILA KARAOSMANOĞLU EDUCATION FUND

Attila Karaosmanoğlu was an outstanding economist and academic. He was a devoted husband, father, and friend. Karaosmanoğlu played a critical role in Türkiye's social and economic development. In his memory, initially, a memorial fund was created to support Çağdaş Yaşamı Destekleme Derneği, an organization he was passionate about. Later, the memorial fund was endowed to support students with scholarships in his alma maters, Karşıyaka Lisesi and Ankara Siyasal Bilgiler Fakültesi.



CANAN GÜRMAN MURTHY MEMORIAL FUND

Canan Gurman Murthy was an aspiring businesswoman and a passionate women's rights supporter. She was also an unconditionally caring mother and a wife. When she passed away from ALS, her husband NC Murthy and their son Arjun established a memorial fund and built a kilim-weaving workshop in Van, Türkiye in her name. Now, Canan's **legacy** lives on in each kilim these young women make.



SABUS EDUCATION MEMORIAL FUND

The Ağırnaslı family created the memorial fund as a way to honor their late mother, Sabahat Buruloğlu, who was committed to education. Sabahat Buruloğlu graduated from İstanbul University Law School and passed the bar exam in 1952 to become one of the first female lawyers in early modern Türkiye. She believed that all girls deserved a chance to excel in their lives through education, and this fund carries on her legacy. It has since been used to establish an endowed scholarship fund at Toplum Gönüllüleri Vakfı in her name to support a female student at her alma mater, İstanbul University Law School.



THE ZİYA G. BOYACIĞİLLER MEMORIAL FUND

The Ziya G. Boyacıgiller Memorial Fund was established to celebrate Ziya Boyacıgiller's life and fulfill his long-lasting dream of giving and continuing his legacy. Everyone who knew Ziya Boyacıgiller was an effective leader because of his tremendous ability to inspire people, unique strategic insight, and calm personality. Ziya Boyacıgiller Memorial Fund supports aspiring entrepreneurs.



DOROTHY AND ROBERT KELLER MEMORIAL FUND

Three Alumni of Talas College, Haldun Tashman, Hulusi Zafer Ecevit, and Marz Attar, pay tribute to their beloved teachers, Dorothy and Robert Keller, by establishing a memorial fund in their honor supporting education. The Dorothy and Robert Keller Fund supports the "Excellence in Teaching Program" at SEV Foundation to promote the learning culture and engage the SEV teachers and school leaders in continuous professional learning.



EMRE ÖZGÜ MEMORIAL FUND

Emre Özgü was an immigration attorney and partner at Barst, Mukamal, & Kleiner LLP located in New York City. Born to parents who emigrated from Türkiye to the United States in the 60s. Emre was born in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania in 1972. He received his B.A. from Lehigh University in 1994 and his J.D. from New York Law School in 1997. Fluent in Turkish, Emre maintained strong personal and professional ties to Türkiye. He was deeply committed to education and supported many efforts to provide scholarships to underprivileged students in Türkiye. To celebrate Emre Özgü's life, the Özgü family established a fund that provides scholarships to students in Türkiye based on academic achievement and financial need.



İREM BÖLÜKBAŞI MEMORIAL FUND

The İrem Bölükbaşı Memorial Fund was established to honor the legacy of İrem Bölükbaşı who touched many hearts and minds with her kindness, laughter, and friendship. İrem pursued groundbreaking research in polymer science at UMass Amherst and made significant contributions as a Product Development Engineer at 3M. She brought out the best in everyone around her and was an exemplary collaborator. İrem's kindness, friendship, cleverness, courage, faith, and joy filled every room and overflowed into the hearts of those who knew her, continuing to inspire us to be better friends, scientists, and people. The İrem Bölükbaşı Memorial Fund has been established to support young scientists through scholarships and educational opportunities and carry forward her legacy.



YUSUF GALİP ÜÇOK ENDOWED ORPHAN FUND

Yusuf Galip Üçok, an educator, was born in 1916 in Bunyan, Kayseri. He became an elementary school teacher and taught in one-room village schools in Pinarbasi, Burunguz, and Bunyan. In 1955, he moved his family to Istanbul along with his in-laws. The move to Istanbul from Bunyan was initiated by one of his brothers-in-law's entrance to the Technical University of Istanbul. Thinking about the future and desiring to educate his children, this move made sense to him, although it came with hardship. He first started teaching in elementary schools in distant small villages from the Istanbul region, away from his family. In 1957, he was assigned to Mevlana

Kapi Orphanage (Mevlana Kapi Yetistirme Yurdu) as a teacher and mentor for orphan children ages 13 to 18 years. This assignment was one of the important highlights of his long teaching career. Since he grew up as an orphan himself, this assignment was very personal. He was loved by his students, who visited him frequently at his house on weekends and stayed for dinners with the family. Yusuf Galip Üçok, a dedicated teacher, wanted to make sure these kids were educated and/or learned skills before leaving the orphanage and becoming productive members of society. He later happily realized that his longtime dream of educating his children came true. His two sons became engineers and his daughters became a homemaker, lawyer, and architect.

The endowed fund grants to orphanages in Türkiye was established by his son, Hikmet Üçok, and daughter in-law Marilyn Üçok of California to honor his father's legacy at the Mevlana Kapi Orphanage. The memorial fund's intent is to motivate orphans to pursue their education– academic and/or vocational, and also provide support for aged-out orphans in their transition out of the orphanage. The grants will be issued once a year.




RASIM AND NESRIN BAYRASLI SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Rasim Bayraslı's life was defined by resilience, hard work, and an unwavering belief in the power of opportunity. Born in Crimea in 1936, he fled Soviet rule as a child, eventually settling in Türkiye before emigrating to the United States in 1962. Alongside his brothers in Brooklyn, Rasim built a life through dedication and perseverance, working tirelessly in auto repair without formal training. A devoted family man, passionate gardener, and avid sports enthusiast, he approached life with humor, generosity, and an unbreakable spirit. In honor of his values and belief that anyone can achieve greatness with the right support, this scholarship provides educational opportunities to students from Eskişehir, Türkiye—fueling potential, ambition, and future success.

A Memorial of HOPE, EDUCATION AND GENEROSITY:



The Rasim Bayraslı Memorial Fund



Born in Crimea in 1936, under Soviet rule, he fled with his family at just eight years old. They landed in Germany, where he played soccer barefoot, and later settled in Eskişehir, Turkiye, after World War II. He went to Atatürk Lisesi, and in the early 1960s, followed his older brothers to the United States. Alongside his siblings, he opened an auto repair shop in Brooklyn. With no formal training, he built a life grounded in hard work, persistence, and curiosity. Rasim never stopped moving, never stopped trying.

Family was everything to him. A devoted husband to Nesrin and father to Elmira, Ercüment, and Elif, he worked tirelessly to provide for them. Rasim carried himself with humility and a deep sense of responsibility. He believed in hard work, integrity, and the importance of education, not just as a means of personal success, but as a way to uplift

entire families and communities. He loved gardening, sports, and jokes, and even when his health started to fail, he always found a way to laugh, to make you laugh, or simply see the good in a moment.

Education and curiosity were values Rasim and Nesrin carried all their lives. Though neither went to college, they admired learning, encouraged exploration, and constantly looked for ways to help young people pursue their dreams. That spirit became a gift they passed on to their children.

In 2024, just a few months before Rasim passed away, his children — Elmira, Ercüment, and Elif — decided to create a memorial scholarship fund in his name. Nesrin was proud that their children were determined to honor him in a way that reflected his values and continued his impact. For the family, the decision was about more than remembrance. It was about transforming memory into action. **The Rasim Bayraslı Memorial Scholarship Fund** reflects Rasim's lifelong commitment to opportunity and fairness, serving as a bridge between his values and the future he would have wanted for others.

Creating a memorial fund is a deeply personal act, but at TPF it is also profoundly flexible. Just as every individual's life is unique, so too are the ways families can choose to honor their loved ones. As Elmira says, "You don't have to be rich to create a memorial fund. You just need to have the will." And they did.

The Bayraslı family chose to support students from Eskişehir, Türkiye, Rasim's home, helping them pursue higher education anywhere in the country. In its first year, three students received support, and the family is determined to grow the fund so even more young people can follow their dreams.

This scholarship is more than financial assistance. It is about hope. It is about legacy. It is about turning a life built on hard work, family, and belief in education into opportunities for others. Through this fund, Rasim's family is keeping his spirit alive, honoring his generosity, and giving young people from Eskişehir the chance to dream bigger. Just as he always wanted.

The Bayraslı family's choice is one example among many, but it speaks to something universal: the desire to keep a loved one's story alive by continuing their good work. A memorial fund is not only about memory. It is about carrying forward the values that defined a life, transforming grief into growth and legacy into impact.

She designated charitable bequests to five organizations in Türkiye—the Turkish Oncology Foundation, Hand-in-Hand Foundation (TSK Elele Vakfı), Foundation for Children with Leukemia, Turkish Education Foundation, and Darülaceze Foundation.

Rooted in Trust, GROWING IN LEGACY:



The Eser Family's Gift to the Future



hen Özlenen Eser Kalav first sat around the table with a small group of like-minded visionaries nearly two decades ago, she could not have imagined all that Turkish Philanthropy Funds (TPF) would become. What began as a dream, a belief that Turks living in the United States could come together to pool resources, amplify their giving, and make a lasting difference in Türkiye and beyond—has grown into the most trusted philanthropic organization among the Turkish-American community.

Özlenen's fingerprints have been on TPF since its earliest days. As one of its founders, she brought not only her lifetime of breaking barriers and her sharp strategic mind, but also her conviction that philanthropy is most powerful when it is both personal and collective. Throughout her career, Özlenen had often been the only woman in the room—the lone female voice at the table. With determination and vision, she not only earned her seat but also made space for others to follow.

That same pioneering spirit guided her in philanthropy. From the very beginning, Özlenen believed that TPF could be more than just an institution; it could be a platform where personal values and collective action meet. For her, the mission was never simply about giving money. It was about building something enduring—a

platform where families and communities could create legacies that would inspire generations.

For Özlenen, that idea of legacy was not theoretical. It was something she carried quietly in her heart ever since she lost her mother years ago. The loss marked her deeply and planted a question she has carried ever since: How do we make sure that who we are, and what we value, continues beyond us?

Breaking barriers as a woman is, in fact, a family legacy. Nearly a century earlier, her mother had been one of the first women educators of the Turkish Republic in the late 1920s. At a time when opportunities for women were scarce, her mother believed passionately in education as a force for progress and equality. She taught not only in classrooms but also through example, showing that women could lead, could inspire, and could help shape the future of a nation.

Losing hermothermade Özlenen reflect on what remains after we are gone—not just wealth or possessions, but values, memory, and the lives we touch. The question became even more urgent last year, when she lost her brother. How could she transform grief into something that would give life to others? The grief was profound, but it also crystallized her vision: her family's story could live on, not only in remembrance but in impact.



Professionally, Özlenen has always been someone who could see possibility where others saw obstacles. Now she turned that same lens inward, asking: How can my family's story become a source of hope for others? She imagined a fund that would not only carry her family's name, Eser, but also carry forward their values—resilience, generosity, education, and opportunity.

Her decision was bold and deeply personal: she chose to make a planned gift of real estate through TPF to establish the Eser Family Fund. It was a way of transforming something tangible into something timeless, ensuring that her mother's pioneering spirit, her brother's memory, and her own life's work would all continue to inspire.

For Özlenen, choosing TPF was natural. She had helped build it. She knew its rigor, its transparency, and its commitment to community. But beyond that, she trusted TPF as the place where personal legacy becomes part of something greater. She trusted that her family's name would be honored not only through careful stewardship but also would grow—adapting to meet the changing needs of the future, creating impact while staying true to the values of the past.

Yet true to her nature as both a professional leader and a TPF founder, Özlenen's vision does not stop with her own family. Just as she once imagined what Turks in America could achieve by giving together, she now imagines what could happen if more families embraced legacy



giving. Her hope is that her example will encourage others to see philanthropy not as something left behind at the end of life, but as something lived. She hopes her story will encourage other families to give boldly, to live their values now, and to weave their names into the fabric of future generations.

"Trust is everything," Özlenen often says. For her, TPF embodies that trust. Trust that her family's legacy will live on. Trust that her gift will be used wisely and stewarded with the highest integrity. Trust that her story—her mother's, her brother's, her own—story will continue to be written, not just on the pages of history, but in the lives of those touched by their generosity.

This fund is not the end of a story. It is the beginning of a new chapter. A chapter where grief is transformed into giving, where one family's name becomes a wellspring for many others, and where a legacy of barrier-breaking women continues to open doors for generations to come.

At TPF, we are honored to be part of this journey. The Eser family's legacy will ripple outward for years to come—proof of what Özlenen herself has always embodied: that when you break barriers, you open doors not only for yourself, but for everyone who follows.

Because legacy is not only about what we leave behind. It is about what we live, and how we inspire others to carry it forward.

Meet the 2025 TPF Changemaker Scholars

At Turkish Philanthropy Funds, every scholarship opens a door to a new story. This year's Changemaker Scholars are musicians, architects, filmmakers, economists, counselors, engineers, and innovators—all united by a vision of shaping a better tomorrow. Their paths are different, but together they show the power of education and remind us that when donors invest in education, they help write stories of impact that extend far beyond one individual, creating ripples across entire communities.



SELÍN ALGÖZ is the first recipient of the **Turkish-American Orchestra Music** Award under the TPF Changemaker Scholarship Fund. Growing up in a small town in Türkiye, where classical music was rarely heard, she discovered a deep passion for the violin. Today, she serves as the principal violinist of the Manhattan School of Music Symphony Orchestra and is one of only three violinists admitted each year into its prestigious graduate program. "I'm incredibly honored and grateful to receive the Changemaker Scholarship. This support helps me continue my journey as a violinist, committed to my dreams, goals, and education. It brings me one step closer to building the career I envision—one where I can inspire and empower others through music," she shared.



NURSENA ÇOLAK, from Istanbul—a city shaped by frequent earthquakes—is passionate about designing safer, more resilient cities. Selected as the **TABNET** Scholar, awarded in partnership with the Turkish American Business Network, she will focus her studies on earthquake resilience and sustainable architecture. "This prestigious scholarship not only provides essential financial support but also reinforces my belief that thoughtful, resilient, and inclusive design has the power to transform societies," she said.



ÇAĞLA DEMİRBAŞ, an emerging filmmaker, is eager to grow as a storyteller in New York City's dynamic creative scene. "Being selected as a Changemaker Scholarship recipient at such a pivotal moment in my life allowed me to dream bigger. Upon graduating from Columbia, I aspire to represent Turkish cinema on international platforms and tell stories that connect us," she shared.



URAZ EREN, an aspiring economist, will continue his journey at Arizona State University. "Being selected as a Changemaker Scholarship recipient means recognition not just of my academic efforts, but of my potential to positively impact the world through economics. It means someone believes in my vision of using economic insight to create real change—to build more inclusive markets, promote financial literacy, and design policies that expand opportunities for all," he noted.



BENSU MERCAN is pursuing a degree in Mental Health Counseling, with a mission to advocate for underserved communities. "Being selected as a Changemaker Scholarship recipient means a lot to me. It feels like someone is saying, 'We see the work you've done, and we believe in where you're going.' It gives me not just financial support, but also hope and motivation to keep moving forward," Bensu said.



ALİ KAAN NARİN, recipient of the Banu Onaral Scholarship, aspires to become a biomedical researcher dedicated to solving global health challenges. "The Changemaker Scholarship is a testament to the path I have walked till now and a reminder of a promise I've made to myself. THE ÜÇOK FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FUND



he Üçok Family Scholarship Fund, established by Hikmet and Marilyn Üçok, provides young women from Türkiye with the opportunity to pursue secondary education in the United States—particularly in fields such as health sciences and special education. Awarded once every four years, the scholarship reflects the family's belief in the power of education to transform individual lives and entire communities. The next cycle will open in 2028.

The Üçoks believe deeply in the transformative power of education and envision a world where every young woman, regardless of her background, is equipped with the knowledge and skills to meet life's challenges. Their hope is that each scholar not only excels academically but also gains a broader cultural perspective during her time in the U.S.—an experience that enriches both her personal growth and professional future.

By returning to Türkiye with new skills, knowledge, and confidence, these scholars will strengthen their communities and, in turn, inspire others. The Üçok family's wish is that this cycle of learning and giving will encourage recipients to embark on their own philanthropic journeys—lighting the way for future generations.

SENA EKEN SCHIEBER ECONOMICS AWARD

he Sena Eken-Schieber Economics Awards was established in 2015 by George Schieber to honor his late wife, Sena Eken-Schieber, an inspiring economist who made a mark in the field of Economics. Created uniquely for female students specialized in Economics, the award supports their graduate studies at top-ranked universities in the United States.

Since its inception, 19 young women have followed in Sena's footsteps, pursuing advanced studies with the ambition of becoming leaders in their field. Today, alumni of the program are building careers in Economics across the globe-each motivated, like Sena, to make an impact and leave their own mark on the discipline.

"These young women reflect our hope for future sustainable global development, equity, prosperity, and knowledge sharing in our increasingly fragmented, reactionary, and dysfunctional world. I have little doubt that their motivations, social and personal aspirations, and formidable intelligence will fuel their future personal and intellectual growth, and assist them in making much-needed societal contributions globally, as well as in both Turkiye and the United States. In fact, a recent IMF study found that 'education accounts for fully half of total economic growth and two-thirds of real income gains among the world's poorest 20 percent since 1980,' and, surprisingly, that 'a year of postsecondary education will increase a person's earnings by more than 13 percent over those of a person with secondary education alone.' I wish them the best of luck on this challenging journey they have only just begun" says Dr. George Schieber, Sena's husband, a retired World Bank Economist



Meet the 2025 Sena Eken-Schieber Economics Awardees

All three awardees are Economics majors with GPAs above 3.7 from top universities in Türkiye, united by a shared dream: to make their mark in a discipline that remains male-dominated around the world. Their path to success was clear—they aimed to equip themselves by studying at prestigious universities in the United States, learning from professors with exceptional expertise, and taking full advantage of the valuable resources these institutions offer. Their achievements are a powerful testament to what becomes possible when talent meets opportunity.

Yet despite their dedication, the high cost of living and tuition posed a significant barrier. That's when the Sena Eken-Schieber Economics Award, a scholarship fund established to honor the legacy of a brilliant, courageous, and determined economist, stepped in to invest in their potential—just as it has for many young women before them.


Sıla, an Economics major from Boğaziçi University, will begin her master's in International and Development Economics at Yale University, where the acceptance rate is just 9%. For Sıla, this recognition was deeply meaningful not only as a student but also as someone committed to making economics more inclusive and impactful. She is motivated to be part of the change in a field traditionally dominated by men and to encourage others to see that they, too, belong in economics.



At Turkish Philanthropy Funds, we believe education is the most powerful tool for unlocking opportunity and breaking cycles of inequality. Our commitment goes beyond access—we work to ensure that every student, regardless of gender, ability, or socio-economic background, has the resources, support, and opportunities to thrive. From scholarships for underrepresented students to programs that bridge the digital divide and train educators, we invest in initiatives that level the playing field and empower learners to reach their full potential. Türkiye continues to face challenges with academic and socioeconomic disparities in education. Recent Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) results show that Türkiye ranks near the bottom among OECD countries in both academic and social inclusivity. A significant portion of students are underperforming in key areas-38.6% in mathematics, 29.3% in reading, and 24.7% in sciencehighlighting the urgent need to strengthen foundational skills and address child poverty to ensure equal opportunities for all students.

At Turkish Philanthropy Funds, we support pioneering **health innovations** that unlock access to quality care for all—leveraging digital tools, mobile clinics, and community partnerships to overcome healthcare gaps and empower underserved populations in Türkiye.

We champion **gender equality** as a cornerstone of thriving, inclusive communities. Our initiatives empower women and girls through education, economic opportunity, leadership development, and advocacy—breaking down barriers and challenging harmful norms. By partnering with organizations that drive systemic change, we work to ensure that every individual, regardless of gender, can participate fully, lead confidently, and shape a more equitable future.



Types of Grants

ADVISED GRANTS

Represent the majority of TPF's grantmaking. These grants are distributed from the giving funds at TPF at the recommendation of founding donors or fund advisors, ensuring each gift reflects the donor's unique vision.

DESIGNATED COMMUNITY GRANTS

Distributed from funds created to provide ongoing support for specific TPF partner organizations, ensuring sustained investment in their missions and long-term growth.

SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS


Awarded to help students pursue their educational goals in the US. These grants nurture the next generation of leaders, empowering them to shape brighter futures for themselves and their communities.


DISCRETIONARY GRANTS

Awarded through a competitive process from funds established for specific issues. Grant decision are guided by TPF staff expertise and reviewed by the Board of Directors.

With deep roots in our community and a strong expertise in effective philanthropy, we are well-positioned to assess community needs and identify opportunities to support impactful programs. Our discretionary grants are specifically awarded to address new initiatives and emerging needs, particularly in response to disasters, to benefit our community. Applications for discretionary grants are accepted only from TPF partners in Türkiye and details are shared on our website.

The transformation of a site at the Arsuz Community Center in Hatay into a **safe and accessible space for youth cultural and artistic activities**, managed by 'Young Art Ambassadors,' featuring weekly movie nights, a music studio, and art workshops.

The construction and renovation of school basketball courts and organized seminars and training programs to train educators, aiming to assist 350 children in primary and secondary schools in disadvantaged areas affected by the recent earthquake in **developing healthy personalities and identities through the sport of basketball.**

An Innovation and Career Center at Adıyaman University to aid the **long-term recovery of youth**—especially women—by providing software training, technical skills development, and soft skills sessions to enhance employability and foster lasting resilience.

Bilkentpreneurs Challenge project, which helped 15 university students present business pitches, compete for seed funding, **build their professional networks**, and gain recognition for their ideas. A documentary film highlighting the life and legacy of Nermin Abadan Unat, alongside the establishment of a scholarship fund aimed at **empowering female university students in her name.**

A concert showcasing **a lineup of musicians** blending traditional Turkish melodies with Western instruments, featuring the New York Atatürk Chorus.

The "Rights in Frame" project, which promotes the **psychosocial well-being of children** aged 10–18 in post-earthquake Hatay through rights-based creative workshops and the production of a child-led short film.

The "Rebuilding After Disaster: Entrepreneurship Support Program," a pilot initiative in Gaziantep, Kahramanmaraş, and Hatay designed to foster entrepreneurship in earthquake-affected regions by empowering 880 individuals to develop e-commerce initiatives, create jobs, and rebuild socio-economic resilience.

The transformation of a local civil society office in Adıyaman into a youth and community hub, offering workshops, psychosocial support, and vocational training to **strengthen youth engagement**, **emotional well-being**, **and civil society collaboration** in post-earthquake recovery.

The construction of the Village of Science and Art, which will be **open to everyone** who is willing to learn, participate, and contribute in Türkiye.

A campaign to raise public awareness, foster community engagement, and garner **support for animal welfare**, sfocusing on saving and improving the lives of street animals, particularly dogs and cats.



12 cooking workshops for 120 women through the Mutfakna Project, which builds on the success of Mutfak||Matbakh, a solidarity kitchen in Gaziantep, to **economically empower women** and strengthen social cohesion in earthquakeaffected communities.

Access to healthcare services and improved health outcomes for women and children in Hatay, increasing pregnancy, newborn care, and childhood immunization rates for women of reproductive age through digital solutions and on-the-ground initiatives.

A 24-week technology-based education program empowering earthquake-affected women and their children living in container cities, including a six-week **robotics and coding training** that culminates in nationally recognized certifications, enhancing participants' technical skills and employability.

Library and production workshops for the mothers of the TYSD Atatürk Kindergarten, built in the earthquake region to **support preschool education** and foster a love of learning among children and their families.

Toys and rehabilitation resources for 300 children in the Purple Women and Children Safe Space located in the earthquake region, helping young survivors heal, play, and thrive.

Multi-purpose cash assistance to households particularly vulnerable due to the August 2024 wildfires in İzmir, providing **immediate support and stability.**

A computer instruction unit for primary school students, equipping them with **essential digital** skills for the modern world.

Hands-on STEM workshops and reusable, award-winning robotics and coding kits distributed to approximately 2,000 underserved children aged 7–13 across 12 U.S. states, inspiring curiosity and building technical confidence.

Essential science education and resources for 50 children affected by the earthquakes in Türkiye, supplying science kits to a village school to engage children aged 9–13 in hands-on scientific exploration and discovery.

WE CREATED OPPORTUNITIES FOR



1,500 children—especially girls and children with special needs—through inclusive sports, psychosocial support, family activities, and child-led committees, while collaborating with local organizations to ensure access to education, health, and social inclusion.

950 disaster-affected and impoverished children through the OKİ and HİJİ project by providing school supplies and hygiene kits.

350 children in primary and secondary schools in disadvantaged areas affected by the recent earthquake develop healthy personalities and identities through basketball by constructing and renovating school basketball courts and organizing seminars and training programs to train educators.

300 children aged 11–18 affected by the earthquakes in Hatay and Adıyaman, providing each child with holistic care and access to essential services, including protection, social cohesion, meaningful youth engagement, educational activities, and psychosocial support.

255 women in Hatay were affected by the earthquakes through a project that includes inkind financial support for 25 women entrepreneurs, a consultancy hotline providing tailored business advice to 200 women, one-on-one mentoring and capacity-building sessions for 125 women, and the development of a solidarity network to strengthen market access and collective visibility.

200 girls aged 16–18 from earthquake-affected regions through the "TogetHER We Are Strong" project, a six-month empowerment program focusing on career mentorship, academic support, and psychosocial development to help participants overcome systemic barriers, explore career opportunities, and make informed decisions about their academic and professional futures.

100 youth with autism in New York to enter the workforce.

80 women in Hatay by strengthening the Rimmen Women's Cooperative through new product development, skill-building workshops, marketing support, and institutional capacity building.

50 students from Fine Arts High Schools and aspiring university candidates by providing comprehensive music education, including instrument training, music theory lessons, and conservatory preparation.

30 psychosocial support providers in postearthquake Hatay through a project that strengthens their capacity and well-being via training, supervision, and self-care activities.

Companies in industrial zones affected by the August 2024 wildfires in İzmir through a recovery and strengthening mechanism by delivering machinery and raw materials via a procurement process.

4 young fellows through Esas Sosyal's First Chance Program 2024, covering one year of professional expenses.

People with disabilities and their caregivers through psychosocial support, accessibility improvements, capacity-building, and livelihood activities—promoting inclusive, community-based recovery in earthquake-affected areas.

WE PROVIDED

\$549K to support the Post-Disaster Rural Education Support Programme, **addressing urgent educational challenges in rural areas** severely impacted by the February 2023 earthquakes, with the goal of empowering 120 teachers and enhancing program sustainability over two years in affected zones.

\$350K to support the Columbia-TPF Resilience Fund, funding projects led by Columbia faculty in partnership with local NGOs working in regions of Türkiye affected by the February 2023 earthquakes.

\$313K for the construction of a Cancer Screening and Early Diagnosis Center on land donated to the Turkish Oncology Foundation (TOV), **expanding access to life-saving services.**

\$211K for the construction of a Family Health Center with a capacity for four physicians in Hatay, **strengthening local healthcare services** in the aftermath of the disaster.

\$189K for **free treatment for children with leukemia and cancer** at LOSEV Hospital, covering essential medical needs, including routine supplies, medicines, and critical medical equipment.

\$149K for trauma-focused mental health and psychosocial support in Hatay, providing free therapy and workshops to over 250 earthquake survivors—including women, children, and marginalized groups—through World Human Relief's (WHR) prefabricated center in Antakya.

\$140K to provide **mobile, inclusive education** to 800 children aged 6–14 in earthquake-affected and disadvantaged areas—including children of seasonal agricultural workers—through Educational Volunteers Foundation's (TEGV) "Firefly" education trucks, enhancing academic skills, emotional well-being, and equal learning opportunities.

\$128K for the renovation of the Kitchen Building at the Darülaceze Okmeydanı complex, **supporting the ongoing provision of essential services to vulnerable communities.**

\$124K to support a Teacher Support Hub in Hatay, providing psychosocial support, peer collaboration, and professional development for 1,000 educators—restoring well-being and strengthening education in the post-earthquake context.

\$108K for the transformation of the Buradayız Hatay Center into a **youth and community hub offering education, psychosocial support**, cultural activities, and small business support—promoting recovery, resilience, and economic sustainability in post-earthquake Hatay.

\$106K for the purchase of **new technological devices** to support physically disabled students attending the TSK Elele Foundation Special Education and Rehabilitation Center.

\$97K to support **surfing, leadership training, and educational programs** for children and youth in
earthquake-affected Hatay, reaching over 3,000
participants and providing in-depth programs for
selected youth focused on healing, empowerment, and
future opportunities.

\$61K to support the Turkish American Orchestra's current needs, **inspiring and connecting diverse audiences and communities through the universal language of music.**

\$54K for the "Playful Adıyaman" project, promoting the participation of 600 children in urban life through weekly workshops in Hayat Park, a community space codesigned with local children.

Meet Esra

Born and raised in Batman, Esra has seven siblings. Her parents never went to school, and their literacy level is novice. Her father works as a construction worker, with no stable income, and moves from one construction to another in the labor force. Her mother who raised Esra and her siblings is a housewife.

As her parents experienced both financial and social challenges that rose from lack of education, it's been a priority in their household to go to school. No matter which school or where, all family members were encouraged to learn to read and write as opposed to Esra's parents, and get a college degree so that they can all have a brighter future and a place in

our society. One field comes to mind in southeastern Türkiye as the best option for all children to pursue for a steady income and job safety - healthcare. Not surprisingly, all of Esra's older brothers and sister are working in the healthcare sector as technicians and sociologists.



And Esra holds on to the family tradition. She studied medicine at Mersin University and started working last week at the emergency care at a public hospital in Siirt. She takes pride in being the first doctor in her family and treating her patients with care in the region she feels at home. Esra always had good grades in school but the financial difficulties in her household almost held her back despite her parents' devotion to support her.

Thanks to your generosity, Esra has been able to graduate from high school and college and become a doctor in the region, and gives back to her community. She still remembers with a smile on her face the day the PAYDA team paid a visit to her home in Batman, and met with her family. That visit made her feel special, and a true part of the PAYDA family. Today, she is proud to be the first medical doctor in her family. And she cherishes each and everyone one of you as her champions all the way from Siirt.


Meet Revşen

Revsen's story is nothing but extraordinary. Born and raised in Mardin, she has been the star of her high school, Mardin Fen Lisesi. Her grades were top notch since elementary school, and that showed in all of her exams. She was accepted to Robert College, which requires 500/500 in high school exams but her family did not want her to go to Istanbul, boarding at that age. As she was saddened to stay in Mardin not being able to pursue her dreams of studying at her dream school, Revsen did not give up. She focused on her studies and taught herself English, at a pretty advanced level. Her life changed when she met with PAYDA during their visit to Mardin and took her under their wings to support her in every means.

Revsen was selected to join PAYDA's RCIMUN (Robert College International Model United Nations) project -a conference where 500+ students from different backgrounds get together, leaving their ecosystem behind and engage with their peers around daily discussion topics and practice English. That project changed Revsen, reshaped her dreams and vision of her future. She decided there and then that she would like to go pursue her college degree in the States, where she can get the top-notch education with countless opportunities. And this time, she wouldn't let anyone hold her back. Her hard work combined with PAYDA's guidance on college applications, and financial support for SAT exams, she realized her dreams. She got into Brown University with a full scholarship. She is the first student from Mardin High

School accepted to an Ivy League university in the States and hopefully, she won't be the last. PAYDA even convinced her parents to allow Revsen to go to Brown University, explaining the uniqueness of her success and the importance of such educational opportunities.

Inspired by her meeting with Feryal Özel Revşen majored in astrophysics, and graduated with distinction. Today, she works as a science teacher at a charter high school where she takes pride and joy in reaching out to students coming from disadvantaged communities, and making a difference in their lives through science. She would like to continue academics and pursue a PhD degree in the future. As she is grateful for all the support that enabled her to realize her dreams and get out of her ecosystem in Mardin, she considers PAYDA as her family who she can count on no matter what.



Meet Yasemin



Yasemin will be the first female doctor in her village, Idil in Şırnak. It was such a big moment for her community that all the villagers came to her home to congratulate her on acceptance to Koc University's Medical School with full scholarship.

Her success story started at an early age, always motivated by herfather who called her "Professor Doctor Yasemin" at home. Bright and hardworking, she focused on her studies and that didn't go unnoticed by PAYDA. She was in high school when PAYDA volunteers took her under their wings, and supported her more than financially. Through mentors, and camps around social development, Yasemin found herself surrounded by an amazing community who cheered for her to realize her dreams. As she studies medicine at Koç University, she's passionate about discovering other fields such as psychology and political science to equip herself with all the opportunities she could find.

Her dream is to complete her degree in Türkiye, and then continue her studies in the United States. After traveling to the States last year for an internship through PAYDA's incredible network, she decided then and there that she would like to earn her specialty in the States. Her time here made her feel so welcome that she would like to experience this culture where everyone is accepted and appreciated as who they are. Progress in the medical field being top notch in the States is another contributing factor to her dream of studying here and becoming the best in her field.

Even when Yasemin had lost her mother unexpectedly a couple of years ago, she was resilient in a remarkable way that she scored on top in her studies. As an inspiring, hardworking woman in her twenties, she shows us how much young women from disadvantaged communities can accomplish if they're provided with opportunities in life. It's your kindness and support that enables Yasemin and many others in Türkiye to push the boundaries of inequalities in life. Yasemin will be the first female doctor in her village, and with your support, her journey is only beginning.

Esra, Revşen, Yasemin... these are just three among hundreds of young women whose lives have been transformed by PAYDA, each breaking through the inequalities they were born into. From Streets to Treats

year ago, Türkiye introduced the "Animal Protection Law," allowing stray animals to be collected and placed in shelters. Yet the reality has proven challenging. While shelter capacity stands at around 105,000, nearly 4 million stray dogs and cats continue to live on the streets. This gap has led to overcrowded shelters, where animals face new struggles, from poor living conditions to limited access to vaccinations and proper nutrition.

At TPF, we believe that all creatures deserve to live in dignity, in health, and surrounded by the care and love they deserve — including stray animals. Our solution has been to partner with Dört Ayaklı Şehir, supporting the well-being of stray animals by facilitating neutering, increasing shelter capacities, and improving the adoption process. Thanks to your generous support for TPF's Street Animals campaign, incredible changes have been made for these animals, most importantly helping them find loving homes and families.

Meet Karamel, who was abandoned when he was only two weeks old. Without proper care, he was malnourished and had difficulty breathing. Your support enabled us to provide immediate treatment, which continued for three months until he was healthy. The first challenge was complete — healing Karamel — but the second one proved even harder. For six months, he waited for a

family to adopt him, until a dog-loving family with a five-year-old German Shepherd met him and took him home. Today, Karamel spends his days spoiled with love and treats, happily playing and napping.

Karamel is lucky compared to Sezen, a three-month-old puppy saved from the rubble after the earthquake in Antakya. She was the only survivor from her apartment, including her family. With a fractured bone and damaged organs, Sezen was in intensive care for four months, yet she did not give up and regained her health thanks to your generosity. It took 900 days for a family to adopt Sezen, but the wait was worth it. Today, she is with her forever family all the way in Berlin chasing pigeons with joy.

Nar, Coco, Nana, Mec, and many more — once stray dogs and cats — now have the chance to start fresh, leaving insecurities and harsh living conditions behind. You gave them a second chance at life, which they are fulfilling to the fullest, safely in their new homes, surrounded by love with their newfound forever families.

Yet our work is far from over. Every day, thousands of stray dogs and cats still struggle to survive on the streets. With your support, we can expand our reach—offering safety, healing, and compassion. Together, we can give every animal the chance to live the life they deserve.







Carrying Forward Zehra Taşman's Legacy

Through Empowering Women

early a decade ago, Sibel unlocked the door to a modest beauty center in Bolu, a quiet city ringed by forests and mountains. What began as a means of livelihood soon became something more intimate: a refuge. Within its walls, she has created not only an income stream for her family, but also a rare kind of community—where women feel at ease, where the rituals of trimming, styling, and pampering often give way to something deeper: conversation, counsel, a safe space to exhale.

For outsiders, Sibel's story might already look like the fulfillment of a dream. But for her, the shop has always been the first act of a larger ambition. She envisions a beauty academy, the first in Bolu, where young women could gain both the training and the confidence to step into the industry—whether as skilled employees or eventual owners themselves. Recently, she took tangible steps in that direction, converting her own two-story building into a learning center and painstakingly securing permits for structural upgrades. Her savings carried her as far as they could; after that, she needed something more.

That something arrived in the form of the Zehra Taşman Women's Empowerment Program, a program of Bolu Bağışçılar Vakfi (BBV). When Sibel applied, her determination stood out. She was admitted.

In the same cohort was Muhterem, a farmer whose life's work is the soil. She grows fruit, vegetables, and legumes with an emphasis on organic methods, but her aspirations reach further: sustainable seed production, a stronger marketing chain, and—most of all—raising awareness among fellow farmers about the fragile ecosystems they depend on. For her, too, ambition required more than grit; it required mentors, resources, and a network. The program welcomed her as well.





The Zehra Taşman Women's Empowerment Program is less an intervention than a kind of inheritance. It honors its namesake, Zehra Taşman, who, as a gifted student, had to abandon her education for lack of money but never lost her devotion to learning. Her son, Haldun Taşman—Chairman Emeritus of TPF—created the program to extend the opportunity his mother had been denied. In a way, every woman who enters the program carries forward what Zehra could not pursue herself.

Today, Sibel and Muhterem, along with their peers, find themselves not only with financial support but with something deeper: the training, guidance, and solidarity that help a business grow from fragile idea to sustainable enterprise. Sibel's academy and Muhterem's farm are not simply individual projects, but the growth of a larger vision, seeded by one woman's unfinished story and nurtured into many futures.

As TPF, we are proud to be part of this project and to carry forward Zehra Taşman's legacy through many more entrepreneurial women to come!

You Can Be in the Olympics

as a Supporter!

t just 17, Derin Deniz Sorguç is already making history for Türkiye. She began her sporting journey with horse riding and skiing, but it was kiteboarding that truly captured her heart. In 2020, she switched to Formula Kite, joined the national team in 2021, and became part of the Olympic team in 2022.

For over a year, TPF has supported Derin, helping her train, travel, and compete in championships both at home and abroad through our partnership with Akut Sports Club, which is dedicated to training and empowering young athletes while promoting teamwork, resilience, and community responsibility. Some competitions she won, others gave her invaluable experience — but every race brought her closer to her dreams. Even when serious knee and foot injuries threatened to slow her down, Derin never gave up. In 2024, she helped Türkiye secure an Olympic quota at the Last Chance Regatta in France, proving that women can shine in Formula Kite. In 2025, she became the U19 European Champion and placed third in the U21 European Championship.

This is exactly where we want to see young women: dreaming big, facing challenges head-on, and never giving up. Derin's next goal is the 2028 Olympic Games in Los Angeles, and we stand with her — from Türkiye to the Olympics—wherever she goes, carrying our hopes and pride. Every supporter can be part of her journey. Are you with us?



Empowered and Resilient TEACHERS

orn and raised in Istanbul, Aleyna had always dreamed of becoming a teacher. For years, she worked at a prestigious private school, close to her family and earning a steady income. Yet something was missing. She believed that all children deserve access to quality education — whether in private or public schools, in bustling cities or remote villages. Determined to turn this belief into action, she made a life-changing decision.

When the twin earthquakes struck Southeast Anatolia in 2023, Aleyna requested to be assigned to the affected region. Her request was quickly accepted, and soon she arrived in Samsat, a small town in Adıyaman. There, she became a first-grade teacher in a school that welcomed children from nearby villages, local families, and families displaced by the disaster. It was the community Aleyna had long dreamed of serving but it came with immense challenges. Many students carried the weight of trauma of the earthquakake. Others had limited access to technology or lacked supportive learning environments. Within a year, the demands of the classroom and being homesick left Aleyna feeling exhausted, unsure of her abilities, and even questioning her future as a teacher.

That's when KODA stepped in with the Post–Disaster Rural Education Support Programme. Designed specifically for teachers like Aleyna, working in the earthquake region, the program paired them with experienced mentors who offered guidance, encouragement, and practical strategies. Teachers like Aleyna also joined workshops focused on social and emotional learning, designed not only for their students' well–being but also for their own. Aleyna discovered the program on social media, applied, and was selected to participate. The impact has been profound. Today, she is deeply grateful, feeling more confident both in her teaching skills and in the way she engages with her students. As someone who traditionally followed rules to the letter and was more mature than her peers, Aleyna's greatest challenge had been connecting with children and meeting them at their level. support, she has learned to connect with children through play, empathy, and encouragement. She also struggled with managing her reactions when students were unkind, quarreled, or did not fully engage in projects. When conflicts arise in the classroom, she now responds with calm and compassion rather than frustration. Her students, in turn, see her not as a strict authority but as someone who believes in them, disappointed when they fall short, yet always encouraging them to try again.

KODA's teacher support program has been transformative for Aleyna, and for many more teachers in the region. As TPF, we are proud to stand with each and every one of them and excited to see what their students will accomplish in the future. When teachers are resilient and empowered, so too are their students.

elcome to the Tebdil-i Mekan Festival, where earthquake-impacted youth discovered something extraordinary: healing. And it happened through the simple yet powerful combination of being together and creating art.

At the heart of the festival were 14–17-year-old Art Ambassadors, who co-created every detail. Their vision turned four days into a living expression of resilience. In this powerful festival, songs carried new meaning, dances shook off sorrow, and handmade crafts helped turn a new page. In every activity, art became a path toward healing.

The festival was made possible by a collaboration of 14 NGOs working in the earthquake region, offering a breath of fresh air to youth, most of whom have lived in temporary container housing since February 2023. Together, they transformed a difficult reality into a celebration of solidarity and renewal, a world momentarily rebuilt by young people themselves.

By the end of each day, the joy on their faces said it all. They felt safe, connected, and free to be themselves—without fear of judgment. Smiles replaced worry, laughter echoed through the tents, and the question on everyone's lips was the same: "When is the next one?"

While 14 organizations, including TPF, brought this festival to life, the true heroes were you: our donors. Through your contributions to the TPF Earthquake Fund, you gave these young people a rare gift: a safe space to feel connected, to heal, and to imagine a brighter future.

Weaving ART, MEMORY, AND HOPE

The Story of Hüsamettin Koçan and Baksı

üsamettin Koçan was born in a remote village 45 kilometers from Bayburt, where life was defined by hard work and resilience. Raised by his mother in this rugged landscape, he carried her strength and determination with him as he set out into the world. That journey led him to Istanbul, where he studied at the State Applied Fine Arts School and later taught at Marmara University, eventually becoming a professor and dean. Along the way, he earned recognition abroad, including the Salzburg City Honor Award in Austria, and chaired UNESCO's International Association of Plastic Arts in Türkiye.

Yet despite a career that placed his paintings in museums and earned him respect in academic circles, Koçan never lost sight of the place he came from. "The place where you were born and raised is your center," he has said. For him, art was not only about galleries and exhibitions but about bringing beauty, possibility, and opportunity back home. That vision became the Baksı Museum.

Perched on a hill above the Coruh Valley, Baksı opened its doors in 2010 as more than just a museum. Its architecture invites the landscape inside; its mission bridges contemporary and traditional art. What began as a dream took shape through the Baksı Culture and Arts Foundation, and within a few years, it had grown into an award-winning institution recognized by the European Museum Forum in 2014. Today, it houses exhibitions, workshops, a library, and residencies, but perhaps most importantly, it is a living hub for its community.

Baksı has created new livelihoods in a region long defined by migration and scarcity. Women gather in workshops to practice embroidery and weaving, reviving traditional crafts while earning income. Children come for art programs that connect them to new ideas while anchoring them in their heritage. In Koçan's view, the museum is not just a cultural space but a way to give life back to a village that once seemed forgotten.



to long-term resilience for earthquake-affected families



After the devastating earthquakes of February 6, 2023, the partnership between Turkish Philanthropy Funds and Baksı took on new urgency. Together, they created opportunities for women affected by the disaster, turning the museum's ateliers into spaces of resilience and renewal.

That is how Nergis, a mother of two, found her way there. Widowed and struggling to make ends meet in her village, she grew vegetables, kept her expenses low, but had few ways to earn steady income. One day in Bayburt, she spotted a brochure for an embroidery workshop. Stepping into the atelier, she discovered rows of yarn in every color and women weaving side by side, laughing and working together. For her, it was more than a workshop; it was a way to rebuild her life.

Each stitch she now sews carries more than thread. It carries dignity, companionship, and hope. And in this, you can sense the enduring presence of women like Hüsamettin Koçan's mother, whose quiet determination first shaped his path. Her spirit echoes in the stories of Nergis, Suna, Ayşe, and countless others who, at Baksı, are not just weaving textiles but creating brighter futures for themselves and their families.

Overview

Since the February 6th earthquakes, TPF has taken a strategic, needs-driven approach to grantmaking—guided by field assessments, evolving priorities, and a commitment to long-term impact. Beginning with emergency relief, including shelter, food, and hygiene supplies, TPF quickly shifted its focus to emotional healing, rebuilding, and community-led recovery. Local partners were essential in ensuring that every donation made a meaningful, on-the-ground impact.

GlobalGiving and TPF share a long-standing partnership rooted in trust and impact. It began in 2011 when GlobalGiving provided a direct grant to TPF's Van Earthquake Fund. Since then, GlobalGiving has consistently supported TPF's mission. For almost 15 years, GlobalGiving has supported TPF's mission by featuring its programs on its global platform and helping channelling thousands of individual donations toward grassroots-led impact in Türkiye.

In August 2024, this long-standing partnership deepened once again further when GlobalGiving generously contributed a \$200,000 direct grant to TPF's Earthquake Relief Fund—launching a powerful collaboration to strengthen local NGOs and amplify TPF's strategic disaster response.

This grant partnership has supported four critical, community-based projects that address key recovery needs in the region:

- Expanding Access to Healthcare for Women and Children in Southeastern Türkiye Through Digital Health Solutions with – MEDAK
- Equal Access and Youth Participation in Arts and Culture: A Community-Based Model for Post-Disaster Recovery with Talebeyiz Biz Association
- One Big Step for Basketball: Empowering Youth Through Sports in Earthquake-Affected Regions with – BIDEV
- Disaster Scholarships: Ensuring Education and Hope After the Earthquake with– TED

Together, TPF and GlobalGiving are not only delivering critical support but also investing in the long-term resilience of communities—ensuring a recovery that is holistic, inclusive, and led by those who know their communities best.

This trusted partnership deepened further in 2024 with a \$200,000 direct grant to TPF's Earthquake Relief Fund, investing in local communities, strengthening grassroots organizations, and leveraging TPF's deep regional expertise and networks for systemic impact.

LOCALLY LED RECOVERY SOLUTIONS

Lasting recovery requires strong, capable local organizations. TPF invests in NGO capacity—enhancing infrastructure, operations, and program delivery. This dual impact strengthens organizations while fostering resilient, self-reliant communities capable of meeting present and future challenges. In this most recent partnership, four local organizations—MEDAK, Talebeyiz Biz, BIDEV, and TED—were supported.

Challenges and Response

While disasters strike in an instant, recovery is a long and evolving journey. One key challenge is sustaining support over time while staying responsive to changing needs. TPF addresses this through a flexible, three-phase strategy—immediate relief, long-term recovery, and sustainable resilience—grounded in local partnerships and on-the-ground insight. A critical element of this approach is building institutional partnerships that extend impact

and ensure long-term support. GlobalGiving's grant, received 18 months after the disaster, reinforced this model—boosting TPF's ability to support community-led recovery with lasting impact.

Importance of Investing in Local NGOs for Long-Term Impact

Beyond providing direct relief, TPF recognized the critical role local NGOs play in recovery and rebuilding efforts. By investing in the capacity of these organizations, TPF ensures that the foundations of disaster response are strengthened for both today and the future. Through funding and resources, TPF helps NGOs build their infrastructure, enhance their operational capacity, and deliver more effective programs on the ground. This investment enables local organizations to expand their reach, develop resilience, and become better equipped to address ongoing and future needs. It's a dual impact: empowering NGOs to serve communities more effectively while fostering the self-reliance of the communities they serve.

Innovative Partnerships Spotlight

GLOBALGIVING

GlobalGiving, one of the world's largest crowdfunding platforms, has connected over 1.8 million donors with community-led projects across 175+ countries since its founding in 2002. For nearly 15 years, GlobalGiving has partnered with TPF, amplifying its initiatives and channeling vital support to grassroots organizations in Türkiye.

In the aftermath of the 2023 earthquakes in Türkiye and Syria, GlobalGiving launched its Earthquake Relief Fund, raising more than \$7.13 million through over 31,000 donations. This fund not only provided immediate relief such as food, water, and shelter but also invested in long-term recovery. A \$200,000 direct grant to TPF further deepened this trusted partnership, combining GlobalGiving's global reach with TPF's regional expertise to ensure aid is both effective and locally led.

MEDICAL RESCUE ASSOCIATION (MEDAK)

MEDAK is a Türkiye-based nonprofit strengthening public health systems and providing emergency care in crisis zones. After the 2023 earthquakes, MEDAK partnered with HERA Digital Health, deploying 40 volunteers. MEDAK and HERA Digital Health rolled out mobile clinics to serve 5,000 women and created a digital disaster health map reaching 800,000 people in 537 health centers. With TPF's support, the current project combines the HERA Health App with field interventions to improve maternal care, childhood vaccinations, and sexual/reproductive health education. By targeting underserved areas and using Al to track needs, the initiative will continue for three years—expanding access to life-saving services and empowering women and families in earthquake-affected regions.

BASKETBALL FOR EDUCATION FOUNDATION (BIDEV)

BIDEV uses basketball to drive youth development, education, and social impact. Its program, "One Big Step for Basketball," brings the sport to disadvantaged regions, including earthquake-affected areas, by training PE teachers, coaches, and trainers.

In Diyarbakır and Hatay more than 50 educators received multi-day training in coaching, leadership, and emotional support, preparing them to serve as mentors for children in their communities. By fostering teamwork, resilience, and structured activity, the program helps youth recover from trauma while building long-term well-being and opportunity.

TALEBEYIZ BIZ

Talebeyiz Biz is a youth-led organization advancing education, creativity, and civic engagement. Following the 2023 earthquakes, it launched the Equal Access and Active Youth Participation in Arts and Culture project in Hatay to provide psychosocial support through creative spaces.

The Arsuz Community Center was transformed into the "Art Depot," hosting music, theater, visual arts, and workshops. Activities like the Tebdil-i Mekân Youth Art Festival and the Youth Art Ambassadors Program foster leadership and community participation. With TPF's support, the initiative strengthens youth recovery while building long-term, scalable models for cultural resilience.

TURKISH EDUCATION ASSOCIATION (TED)

TED is one of Türkiye's leading educational institutions, advancing equal opportunity and youth empowerment. After the 2023 earthquakes, TED launched the Disaster Scholarship Program to support children who lost one or both parents.

As of September 2024, 640 students are supported, including 71 by TPF. Each student receives tailored aid such as a \$55 stationery grant and \$50 monthly scholarships, along with mentoring, psychosocial counseling, and cultural activities. By ensuring continuity in education, TED and TPF are helping young people rebuild resilience, stability, and hope for the future.

STRATEGIC ALLIANCES FOR LONG-TERM RECOVERY

This collaboration highlights the transformative power of collective action and the importance of forging new, strategic funding partnerships to drive long-term recovery. By bringing together the global reach of GlobalGiving and the deep local expertise of TPF, this partnership demonstrates collaborations can extend the life and impact of support beyond immediate relief. Investing in grassroots and locally active organizations ensures that resources are channeled directly to where they are needed most, while also strengthening the region's capacity for self-led recovery. As disasters grow more complex, embracing long-term strategic partnership models like this one will be essential to delivering sustained, resilient change for communities and the organizations that serve them.

The partnership between GlobalGiving and TPF underscores the critical importance of long-term, strategic collaboration—and the power of combining global reach with local expertise in disaster recovery. By bringing together GlobalGiving's vast donor network and TPF's trusted presence and deep knowledge of Türkiye, this initiative has gone beyond emergency relief to invest in local organizations such as MEDAK, Talebeyiz Biz, BIDEV, and TED. Together, these projects advance healthcare, education, psychosocial healing, and youth empowerment in earthquake-affected regions. Grounded in trust, flexibility, and shared purpose, this multi-project model shows how institutional partnerships can drive systemic change and build resilience where it's needed most. As recovery continues, it offers a blueprint for how global-local collaboration can deliver sustainable, community-centered solutions in the face of future disasters.



CASE STUDY CONNECTING LOCAL TALENT TO GLOBAL OPPORTUNITY

How TPF Connected Underserved Students in Türkiye with Worldwide Career Mentorship

Through the English Chance
Program and a unique partnership
with Goldman Sachs, TPF and
Esas Sosyal opened new pathways
for students from under-resourced
Turkish universities to strengthen
their English, build professional skills,
and connect with global
career mentors.

While the English Chance
Program already provides
language training, career
development, and mentoring, the
partnership with Goldman Sachs
Community TeamWorks added a
powerful new dimension:
the Speed Mentoring Event.

This initiative brought together Goldman Sachs professionals from around the world with Turkish students for real-time, high-impact guidance—broadening horizons, building confidence, and exposing participants to career perspectives at a truly global level.

Key Takeaways

FIRST GLOBAL MENTORSHIP LINK

Through TPF's facilitation with the leadership of Basak Yavuz, a long-time TPF donor and a Partner at Goldman Sachs, Esas Sosyal partnered with Goldman Sachs to bring international professionals directly into the English Chance Program for the first time.

DIRECT GLOBAL EXPOSURE

28 students engaged with 12 Goldman Sachs mentors from offices across the U.S., U.K., and beyond—gaining access to perspectives rarely available to students from lesser-known Turkish universities.

HIGH PARTICIPANT SATISFACTION

Students rated the event extremely positively (overall satisfaction 9.29/10; communication skills 9.29/10; productivity 9.04/10).

CONFIDENCE & CAREER READINESS

Mentors also described the exchange as inspiring and enriching, highlighting the two-way benefits of cross-border knowledge-sharing.

The Challenge

LANGUAGE BARRIERS

Research by Esas Social shows that one in four Turkish university students report inadequate English proficiency.

The Response: Supporting Youth Through Skill-Building

Youth employment in Türkiye is not only an economic challenge—it is also a matter of equity and inclusion. Proficiency in English, professional soft skills, and access to diverse networks are vital drivers of upward mobility, yet for many first-generation university students, these opportunities remain out of reach.

Esas Social launched the English Chance Program in 2020 to address these challenges by offering English training, structured soft-skills workshops by a prestigious institution, Berlitz,—including time management, CV preparation, diversity and inclusion, and interview simulations—and comprehensive career development resources.and global career pathways, which hinders competitiveness in the job market.

Innovative Partnership for Greater Impact Esas Social, TPF and Goldman Sachs

The collaboration between Esas Sosyal, TPF, and Goldman Sachs shows how cross-sector partnerships can multiply social impact. Esas Sosyal brings local expertise and a data-driven approach to youth development; TPF contributes its philanthropic network and facilitated the connection with Goldman Sachs through the Community TeamWorks Program; and Goldman Sachs provides global corporate expertise and volunteer mentorship.

The **Speed Mentoring Event**, which connected Turkish students with Goldman Sachs professionals worldwide for real-time, high-impact career guidance merged language training, professional skill-building, and international mentorship into a single experience. The initiative strengthened employability, built confidence, and expanded students' career horizons.

This partnership demonstrates that when underserved youth, particularly women and first-generation graduates, are equipped with targeted training, mentorship, and access to global networks, they are more likely to overcome systemic barriers. Empowering young people with these tools fosters inclusive economic opportunity and drives long-term social mobility in Türkiye.

"One word: EXCELLENT. Through Esas Sosyal, I had the opportunity to meet mentors whom I would rarely have the chance to meet given my own life circumstances and network. From the moment I joined the program, as Emine Hanım rightly pointed out, the emphasis on social aspects and providing equal opportunities was a priceless example of a future role model for me. Having direct communication with those mentors and participating in such a highquality institutional event was truly delightful for me. I found the event to be highly productive until the very last minute, and I didn't want it to end."

"At a time when I felt inadequate due to lack of experience after the job interviews as a recent graduate, this program gave me hope. I left with many notes; it was fantastic for me."

ESAS SOCIAL

Esas Social is a pioneering social investment platform established in 2015 by Esas Holding, one of Türkiye's leading investment firms. Focused on addressing systemic inequality, Esas Social develops long-term programs that create equal opportunities for young people from underprivileged backgrounds—especially first-generation university graduates from public universities.

Its flagship initiatives, such as the First Chance Program and the English Chance Program, provide comprehensive support through training, mentoring, employment readiness, and language development. Esas Social stands out for its data-driven approach and commitment to measurable impact, social justice, and intergenerational equity.

With strong ties to civil society and the private sector, Esas Sosyal acts as a bridge between youth and opportunity. Their partnership with TPF has enabled their work to reach a wider, global audience and connect with the Turkish diaspora in meaningful ways.

GOLDMAN SACHS

Goldman Sachs is a global financial powerhouse that also leads in corporate citizenship through volunteerism and philanthropy. This partnership reflects Goldman Sachs' belief in the power of knowledge-sharing and inclusive mentorship. By connecting with young people in Türkiye, they help expand career aspirations, build confidence, and open doors to global perspectives.

Beyond the numbers, participants reported increased confidence, improved self-expression, and enhanced networking skills—particularly in English. Engaging with global professionals offered valuable inspiration, career guidance, and motivation to pursue future goals. The experience fostered a strong sense of inclusion, belonging, and career readiness, while providing hope and encouragement to recent graduates facing challenging job market conditions. Mentors and mentees alike described the exchange as mutually enriching, with both sides gaining new perspectives and learning from one another.

Conclusion

The collaboration between Esas Social, TPF, and Goldman Sachs demonstrates how targeted investment, corporate voluntary engagement, and grassroots expertise can unite to empower youth and unlock their potential. Programs like English Chance are vital for closing opportunity gaps and preparing Türkiye's next generation for success in a global economy.

By integrating language training, professional skills development, and global mentorship, and by leveraging innovative cross-sector partnerships, this model not only equips Türkiye's young people for today's job market but also positions them to thrive in an interconnected world.





Investment Management


Effective and strategic investment of assets is one of our key responsibilities. Turkish Philanthropy Funds' investment philosophy is to invest charitable funds prudently that support both growth and grantmaking. TPFs investment portfolio comprises diversified pools managed by specialized investment managers.

- **1 GUIDANCE:** With our Investment Committee overseeing the management of TPF's investment program, we rely on seasoned investment and business professionals drawn from our Board of Directors and the larger community.
- **2 TRANSPARENCY:** TPF consistently works to enhance its reporting, assuring that donors understand our overall strategy for managing long-term and short-term assets. TPF frequently communicates with donors to make it easy to obtain detailed information on our financial position, portfolio performance, administrative fees, and policies. All audits and returns are available on our website.
- **3 CHOICE:** TPF partners with Morgan Stanley Global Impact Funding Trust, Inc. (MS GIFT) to offer a variety of investment options to serve our donors' charitable goals. As the sponsor of TPF's DAFs, MS GIFT manages the investment of DAFs. Funds may be invested in one of eight Investment Pools shown below, as well as a Money Market Pool. Discover these investment pool options that are available to suit various objectives (as of June 30, 2025):

CHANGE IN NET ASSETS over 10 years




TOTAL ASSETS by fund type






